GOD BLESS OUR TROOPS

IN GOD WE TRUST

A View Of Historic Event

Fire Control Man 3rd Class Wayne Riebow had a bird's eye view of history in the making aboard the battleship USS Missouri on September 2, 1945, when General Douglas McArthur accepted the formal surrender of the Japanese, thus officially ending World War II. Wayne was at his battle station on the 5th level above the main deck when McArthur and the Japanese signed the surrender documents. The Missouri, despite only having earned three battle stars to the USS North Carolina's 17, was chosen for the historic event be-

cause not only was Missouri the home state of President Harry S. Truman, but the Missouri had been christened by the President's daughter Margaret.

Raised in Glennie, Michigan, Wayne graduated from Oscoda High School in 1943 at the age of 17 and then got his father to sign for him to enter the Navy. He went to Great Lakes, Illinois, for boot camp, and recalls walking by earlier arrivals who called out, "You'll be sorry" to the newcomers. The first morning they were up at 4 a.m. and breakfast was beans. Wayne says they had to use a lot of ketchup on those beans to help them down! It was also at Great Lakes that Wayne got his first introduction to the infamous dish called SOS, which veterans will recall was a glutinous mass of ground beef on toast. The meaning of SOS cannot be explained here since there is a nasty word involved. Veteran readers will need no explanation! Another uncomfortable event in the new recruit's new life was a visit to the base dentist. Wayne says he had never been to a dentist and the Navy doctor he saw was mad about being in the Navy when he could have been making a lot of money in his practice back home. Without an-

esthetic, and with a foot-operated drill, the dentist filled several teeth.

After basic seamanship training Wayne went to a submarine base in San Diego for fire control training, where he was taught to fire anti-aircraft and main battery guns by computer. Then it was on to Newport, R.I., where the crew of the new 45,000-ton battleship Missouri was assembled. Then they went to Brooklyn Navy Yard where the ship was commissioned. A shakedown

cruise to Trinidad was followed by a trip to Norfolk to load ammunition and to demagnetize the ship against torpedoes. They sailed through the Panama Canal to San Francisco, then were off to the Pacific Theater to join Task Force 58 at Iwojima, where the ship bombarded Mount Surabachi prior to the invasion by the Marines. Wayne remembers the Higgins Boats, loaded with Marines on their way ashore to







battle with the entrenched Japanese.

The Missouri then went to Ulithi in the Mariannas to replenish supplies of ammunition and fuel, then went to Okinawa to bombard the island ahead of the invasion of that Japanese stronghold. It was while off Okinawa that the Missouri and the rest of the fleet were

subjected to Kamikaze attacks. The Missouri was hit twice, the first one on the starboard side five decks below Wayne's battle station. The second one hit the seaplane crane, and the exploto where crew members could see the screws. Wayne has a picture of the Japanese pilot of one of the Kamikazes,

whose mutilated body was given a ceremonial burial at sea. Wayne treasures a piece of that pilot's plane, which he once tried to trade, without success, for a piece of the Missouri's deck. Wayne recalled that they had no casualties except for shrapnel wounds, and said they were a very lucky ship.

The Missouri then went along the coast of Japan to Honshu in company with Royal Navy ships, and bombed the steel mills of Muro out of existence. The ship was 100 miles off the coast of Japan when they got news of the dropping of the atom bomb. "We were happy as larks, especially when we got news of the Japanese surrender," says Wayne. The Missouri took on a Japanese pilot to negotiate the minefields of Tokyo Bay and anchored. And so it

was that local resident Wayne Riebow got to witness the historic event that signaled the end of World War II. Then the ship went home to New York, arriving in time for Navy Day, when President Truman went aboard. After 22 months aboard the Missouri, Wayne was discharged in Great Lakes, where he had started his Navy career.

Wayne spent 42 years in his own retail hardware business, and retired in 1988. He and Janice, married 33 years, came to Ocala in 1994. He volunteers at the Veterans Park, and delivers Meals on Wheels two days a week. He is a life member of the VFW. Of his time in the Navy, Wayne says he tries to forget the bad things he saw, and wishes he had stayed in the service for a career.






Veterans Honoredby Students


