by, sent an email to me reporting 350 buses were being used for active routes. The active fleet consisted of 420 buses leaving 70 buses in reserve. I proposed an amendment to the budget to hold off on the purchase of \$2.6 million dollars in buses this year. The rest of the board voted in support of my amendment proposal.

Recently on September 29 Mr. Crosby reported to the Ocala Star Banner only 300 buses are actually being used for daily routes. This leaves 120 school buses in reserve for the District. Administrators are presenting a revised bus purchase plan to the Board Members at the November 4th workshop.

I will continue to keep a watchful eye on School District expenditures with the current budget situation. I encourage readers to scroll through and view the financial documents regarding School District spending on the Marion County School Board website at:

Ready to Read: Zero to Three

New Marion County Public Library System Program Prepares Children for Reading Readiness.

MARION COUNTY, Fla. (Oct. 15, 2010) - When do children begin to develop the skills needed to read and be successful in school? Many experts agree that it begins at birth. Recognizing how important these skills are, the Marion County Public Library System has designed a new grant-funded program, "Ready to Read: Zero to Three," for parents and caregivers of very young

"Ready to Read: Zero to Three" targets parents and caregivers of children ranging from zero to three years of age. Programs and activities that promote early literacy development and encourage parents to read, sing and talk with their children will be offered at all public library locations and at multiple sites in the community. Community sites and outreach efforts will be provided in cooperation with partner agencies, including Early Learning Coalition of Marion County, Munroe Regional Medical Center, Healthy Families Marion, Hands of Mercy Everywhere, Inc., Marion County Health Department Healthy Start and Childhood Development Services, Inc., Early Head Start program. The grant is funded under the provisions of the Library Services and Technology Act from the Institute of Museum

and Library Services and is administered by the State of Florida.

"Public libraries are centers for early childhood literacy development. We look forward to the opportunity to work with our community partners in an effort to help parents to become their child's first teacher and enhance their child's academic success," said Julie Sieg, Director of the Marion County Public Library System. "This grant will allow us to implement additional in-house and community outreach efforts to reach children at the ages when it will have the greatest positive impact on their ability

Research supports that the more fre-

quently parents read to their children, the more chances they have to develop the skills needed to grow into eager readers. In addition to the "Ready to Read: Zero to Three" program, all nine Marion County public libraries have books, materials, activities and other resources to help parents understand what and how to read to infants, toddlers and preschoolers.

West Nile Virus in Marion County

- Case is first of 2010 -

OCALA - The Marion County Health Department has confirmed a positive case of West Nile virus (WNV) in Marion County.

The positive case is the first of the year for Marion County and was present in a horse. The case was found in a horse in Reddick.

West Nile virus is a mosquito-borne virus that can be transmitted to humans and horses by the bite of an infected mosquito.

Earlier this week, Marion County experienced its fifth case of Eastern Equine En-

Johnny Thompson, Public Information cephalitis (EEE) for 2010, also a mosquitoborne virus, in a Marion County horse.

> The health department advises the public to remain diligent in their personal mosquito protection efforts against WNV, EEE and all other mosquito-borne viruses. These efforts should include the "5 D's" for prevention:

> Dusk and Dawn - Avoid being outdoors when mosquitoes are seeking blood. For many species, this is during the dusk and dawn hours.

> Dress - Wear clothing that covers most of your skin.

DEET - When the potential exists for exposure to mosquitoes, repellents containing DEET (N,N-diethyl-meta-toluamide, or N,N-diethyl-3-methylbenzamide) are recommended. Picaridin and oil of lemon eucalyptus are other repellent options.

Drainage - Check around your home to rid the area of standing water, which is where mosquitoes can lay their eggs.



It's interesting to examine who's supporting and who's opposing Florida constitutional amendment #4, the controversial land use change proposal sponsored by Florida Hometown Democracy that will appear on our November ballot.

A couple of newspaper articles/stories from the fall of 2007 (yes, FHD has been trying to get this amendment onto the ballot for four years) were headlined "Proposed amendment pits builders against voters", and "Businesses look to defeat Hometown Democracy". The latter headed a story by syndicated columnist Carl Miaasen of the Miami Herald, and it observed that of \$841,000 raised to keep this amendment off of the November 2008 ballot (it succeeded) major contributors were the National Association of Home Builders, the Florida Chamber of Commerce, and U.S Sugar Corporation.

Closer to home at least 10 letters on this have been published during the past few months in Marion County's daily newspaper, with about twice as many for as against. Most of the "for" letters have come from educators, environmentalists, housewives, and retiree like myself, while four of those "against" have been specifically identified as having come from the office manager of local home builder, an office worker for another home builder, an employee in an architectural office, and the owner of a small building supply store.

room temperature

- 1 cup powdered sugar, sifted
- 6 tablespoons butter or margarine, softened
 - 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- Powdered sugar (optional for decoration)

FOR CAKE:

PREHEAT oven to 375∞ F. Grease 15 x 10-inch jelly-roll pan; line with wax paper. Grease and flour paper. Sprinkle a thin, cotton kitchen towel with powdered sugar.

COMBINE flour, baking powder, baking soda, cinnamon, cloves and salt in small bowl. Beat eggs and granulated sugar in large mixer bowl until thick. Beat in pumpkin. Stir in flour mixture. Spread evenly into prepared pan. Sprinkle with

BAKE for 13 to 15 minutes or until top of cake springs back when touched. (If using a dark-colored pan, begin checking for doneness at 11 minutes.) Immediately loosen and turn cake onto prepared towel. Carefully peel off paper. Roll up cake and towel together, starting with narrow end. Cool on wire rack.

FOR FILLING

BEAT cream cheese, 1 cup powdered sugar, butter and vanilla extract in small mixer bowl until smooth. Carefully unroll cake. Spread cream cheese mixture over cake. Reroll cake. Wrap in plastic wrap and refrigerate at least one hour. Sprinkle with powdered sugar before serving, if desired.

TID

Be sure to put enough powdered sugar on the towel when rolling up the cake so it will not stick.

'Learn and Earn'

(Ocala) - Workforce Connection's new "Learn and Earn" program helps make hiring and training new employees affordable through subsidized on-the-job training and paid internships.

The program kicks off Oct. 18 with an initial focus on professional and business services and law enforcement. Rolling enrollment continues through April 2011, targeting different industries or occupations each month. The second track, which starts Nov. 15, is geared for employers in the transportation, utilities, manufacturing and distribution industries. **Employers** interested in hiring through Learn and Earn On-the-Job Training (OJT) may receive reimbursement of up to 90 percent of new employees' wages while they're being trained. The program may also cover costs for certification classes, equipment and clothing/ uniforms as well as funds needed to conduct job and background checks.

The Internship Program meets the needs of employers unable to commit to hiring. Workforce Connection will pay interns an incentive of up to \$400 weekly for a maximum of 40 hours per week. In exchange, employers provide interns with three months of work-based training. All interns will be adults ages 18 and older who have recently graduated from a Workforce-sponsored training program.

Job candidates will be chosen from a pool of screened applicants who are unemployed or economically disadvantaged and who meet other Workforce eligibility criteria.

I would have to think it somehow rational that 94 percent of the 12 million Blacks in this country voted for a man because he looks like them (that Blacks are permitted to play the race card), and that they were joined by self-declared "progressive" whites who voted for him because he doesn't look like them.

I would have to wipe my mind clean of all that I know about the kind of people who have advised and taught Barack Obama and will fill posts in his administration - political intellectuals like my former colleagues at the Harvard University's Kennedy School of Government.

I would have to believe that "fairness" is equivalent of justice. I would have to believe that a man who asks me to "go forward the most productive and the generators of

Finally, Americans, I would have to erase from my consciousness the scene of 125,000 screaming, crying, cheering people in Grant Park, Chicago irrationally chanting "Yes We Can!" Finally, I would have to wipe all memory of all the times I have heard politicians, pundits, journalists, editorialists, bloggers and intellectuals declare that capitalism is dead - and no one, including especially Alan Greenspan, objected to their assumption that the particular version of the anti-capitalistic mentality that they want to replace with their own version of anti-capitalism is anything remotely equivalent to capitalism.

So you have made history, Americans. You and your children have elected a Black man to the office of the president of the United States, the wounded giant of the world. The battle between John Wayne and Jane Fonda is over - and Fonda won. Eugene McCarthy and George McGovern must be

very happy men. Jimmie Carter, too. And the Kennedys have at last gotten their Kennedy look-a-like. The self-righteous welfare statists in the suburbs can feel warm moments of satisfaction for having elected a Black person.


