WOCA To Light Up New FM Station



New County Commissioners Sworn Into Office

MARION COUNTY, Fla. (Nov. 16, 2010) - Newly-elected county commissioners Kathy Bryant, 41, and Carl Zalak, III, 31, have officially joined the rest of the Board of County Commissioners. Judge David Eddy swore Bryant and Zalak into office at this morning's county commission meeting. The pair joins Chairman Stan McClain, Vice Chair Charlie Stone and Commissioner Mike Amsden on the Marion County Board of County Commissioners.

Zalak replaces former commissioner Barbara Fitos for the District 4 seat. Bryant replaces former commissioner Jim Payton for the District 2 position. This is the first time Bryant and Zalak have held elected office.

"I am excited about accomplishing the

the citizens of Marion County," Bryant said. Bryant campaigned on budget discipline focusing on essential services and basic needs, pursuing a solid plan for growing and diversifying our local economy, working to keep water and sewer utility rates down and protection of water resources and rights. Bryant is a lifelong Marion County resident, partner in a family-owned business and mother of

Zalak, owner of Busy Bee Waste Services (a multi-county waste management company), is a New York native, decade-long Marion County resident and father of two. During his commission race, Zalak campaigned on job creation through reduction of mandates and regulations, enactment of protects water (and doesn't increase costs) and on decreasing impact fees to encourage growth.

"As a business owner and civic leader, I have dedicated myself to improving our

community," he said. "We are facing difficult challenges, but I am optimistic about the future of our county and the opportunities we have to make a positive impact and difference."

Five Children Perish in Fire

MARION COUNTY, Fla. (Nov. 9, 2010) – Marion County Fire Rescue (MCFR) fire-fighters from seven stations responded to 1760 NE 182nd Place (Citra) at 10:34 p.m. Monday night. Upon arrival within eight minutes, at 10:42 p.m., the approximately 1,400 square foot wood frame structure was completely engulfed in flames.

Firefighters immediately began to rescue occupants from the burning building. Two adult females, ages 54 and 31, were transported to Munroe Regional Medical Center (MRMC); a 21-year old female was flown to Shands with first and second degree burns to her face and upper body; and two unresponsive pediatric females, ages 6 and 12, were transported to MRMC and Ocala Regional and were confirmed deceased at their respective hospitals. Three young males,

ages 8, 13 and 15, also perished in the home fire. There were eight total occupants in the home

The cause of the fire is under investigation and the State Fire Marshal's Office is the lead investigating agency. Although it is unknown whether or not the home had working smoke alarms, MCFR urges citizens to equip their homes with the lifesaving technology and to heed these safety tips:

- Install smoke alarms in every sleeping area of the home, as well as in common areas such as living rooms and hallways.
 - Test smoke alarms monthly.
- Change the batteries in smoke alarms at least twice year: Change Your Clocks; Change Your Batteries.
- Create a fire escape plan, identifying two exits from each room and a safe meet-

ing place outside.

- Practice the escape plan with all family members at least twice a year.
- Call 9-1-1 immediately and from outside the burning building.
- Never go back inside a burning building for any reason.

Unemployment Rate

Nov. 19, 2010

Unemployment rate continues drop in region, still tops state, nation.

Today's release of unemployment data for Citrus, Levy and Marion Counties from the Florida Agency for Workforce Innovation (AWI) indicated a drop in unemployment in the three-county region for October 2010.

Workforce Connection's region posted a 13.5 percent unemployment rate, down 0.5 percent since September and 0.1 percentage point over the year.

Rusty Skinner, chief executive officer for Workforce Connection, said that the drop in the unemployment rate, however, is "difficult to see as a positive" because at the same

time, the labor force in the three counties as well as the number of those with jobs have also declined.

"We have fewer people looking for work and fewer people employed ... That suggests that the reduction in the unemployment rate is because discouraged workers have opted out," Skinner said. "That is not a long term healthy sign.'

Out of a regional labor force of 205,589, there were 27,727 unemployed residents in the region. The labor force has shrunk by 2,525 while the number of those with jobs dropped from 178,880 in September to 177,862.

Skinner noted that as the holidays approach, extended unemployment benefits are expected to end. In the three-county region, 800 are expected to lose their benefits the week of Dec. 4.

"We will likely have a situation of frustrated job seekers as they leave extended benefits with no other option than welfare and food stamps," he said. "We anticipate an increase in the number of customers coming to us over the holidays."

Florida's unemployment rate for October held at 11.6 percent which represents nearly 1.1 million jobless out of a labor force of 9,233,000. Florida's unemployment rate is higher than the national rate of 9 percent – a trend that has continued since February

Marion County's unemployment rate for October is 13.8 percent, a drop of 0.5 percent from September and 0.1 percent lower than October 2009. The Ocala Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) has maintained the third highest unemployment rate in the state.

Citrus County followed with a rate of 13 percent, down from 13.7 percent the previous month. Levy County posted 12.5 percent rate, down 0.6 percent from September 2010. Citrus County's unemployment rate is down 0.1 percent over the year and Levy County is 0.1 percent higher than in October

Marion County's labor force shrunk from 134,468 in September to 132,621 in October, Citrus County dropped from 57,029 to 56,428 and Levy County dipped from 16,617 to 16,540.

In October, nonagricultural employment in the Ocala metropolitan area was 89,600, a loss of 200 jobs since September and a decrease of 900 jobs from the previous year. The Ocala metro job loss over the year is the fourth highest in the state, behind Tampa-St. Petersburg-Clearwater (1,700 jobs), Palm Bay-Melbourne-Titusville (2,000) and Fort Lauderdale-Pompano Beach-Deerfield Beach (3,500).

The number of jobless in Marion County dropped from 19,264 in September to 18,312 in October. In Citrus County those unemployed decreased from 7,791 to 7,352 and in Levy County those without jobs declined from 2,179 to 2,063.

At the same time, the number of those with jobs also dropped in Marion County by 895 to 114,309 and by 162 to 49,076 in Citrus County. Levy County posted gains for the second consecutive month, up 39 jobs for 14,477 employed in October.

Skinner said Workforce Connection continues to work with economic development partners throughout the three-county region to bring new employers to the area as well as provide services and training incentives to help small businesses.

Workforce Connection's on-the-job training, internship program, green jobs training

PREHEAT oven to 350%F. Grease and flour two 9 x 5-inch loaf pans.

COMBINE flour, pumpkin pie spice, baking soda and salt in large bowl. Combine sugar, pumpkin, eggs, oil and juice in large mixer bowl; beat until just blended. Add pumpkin mixture to flour mixture; stir just until moistened. Fold in cranberries. Spoon batter into prepared loaf pans.

BAKE for 60 to 65 minutes or until wooden pick inserted in center comes out clean. Cool in pans on wire racks for 10 minutes; remove to wire racks to cool completely.

For three 8 x 4-inch loaf pans:

Prepare as above. Bake for 55 to 60 minutes.


