I have complained and am as guilty as the next person. When you complain you hear more complaining back. While listening to a sermon in church I realized the importance of it all. Of course the church version is different than the version I present to you today, nevertheless I will attempt to apply it to business, which is real life also.

Governor Rick Scott Announces Budget Proposals

Naples, Fla. - Keeping in line with his 7-7-7 plan and his plan to modernize the Florida Retirement System, Governor Rick Scott announced today that he would send the Legislature a budget proposal that better aligns government workers' pensions with those in the private sector and saves taxpayers \$2.8 billion over two years.

Governor Scott announced that the savings would be realized by requiring government employees to contribute five percent of their salaries to the system and requiring new employees to enroll in investment plans similar to private sector 401(k)s.

'We must bring Florida in line with the private sector and nearly every other state in the country by requiring government workers to contribute towards their own retirement," said Governor Scott.

The Governor also announced his intention to close the Deferred Retirement Option Program to new participants as of July 1, 2011, and to reduce the annual service credit to 1.6 percent for most members (special risk class members, to two percent).

Governor Scott said the Cost of Living Adjustment on retirement benefits will be eliminated for all service earned after July 1, 2011. Current retirees will be unaffected. Those members retiring after July 1, 2011, will receive a three percent Cost of Living Adjustment on the retirement benefit attributable to the service earned prior to July 1, 2011, and no cost of living adjustment for service earned after July 1, 2011.

"Government workers, like private sector employees, deserve the opportunity to save for the future, but taxpayers shouldn't be asked to foot that bill alone."

Governor Scott said that modernizing the Florida Retirement System would help reduce spending and help get government back to its core missions Governor Scott will send his full budget proposals to the Legislature on Monday, February 7th.

Mireille Francois! Shock and delight spread cross Mireille's face when the announcement was made at the Ocala Hilton gala event, January 29. The annual Employee Excellence Awards dinner recognizes the organization's 12 most outstanding employees from the previous year. Mireille, a certified nursing assistant, was singled out for the top honor for her tireless dedication to those most special to her...the patients in her charge who are in their last phase of life.

Born in Haiti, Mireille immigrated to Miami in 1997 and settled in Ocala in 2005. Here she enjoys the community lifestyle of Marion Oaks and began a career with hospice.

Mireille was drawn to the caring profession after the death of her diabetic mother, for whom she was the caregiver. Afterward, Mireille wished she could have given her mother even better care, so she took the necessary training and now offers that higher level of "compassion with a smile" to her patients at the comforting hospice houses known as Estelle's and Sylvia's, operated by Hospice of Marion County. It is in this serene environment of the hospice houses that Mireille has truly found a "home." But Mireille also has family who still call Haiti home, so over the years she has visited frequently. In January 2010, she traveled to her homeland for the last time, returning just days before the earthquake struck. Mireille lost several family members in the tragedy and has not been able to go back since.

Here in her adopted home, she has found fulfillment helping families through the most difficult of life's transitions. A co-worker observed her one day soon after the Haiti disaster as Mireille was leaving work, pocketbook in hand, when she heard a patient call for the nurse. Because everyone else was busy, Mireille patiently put down her purse and went to the patient. She knew this patient wanted to go outdoors and was sitting up in bed ready to go, so she took him for a walk: "It could have been his last walk," she says matter-of-factly. "Sometimes the simple things make patients so happy." This unselfish giving and professionalism during her personal time of grief demonstrates Mireille's "hospice heart."

When she was presented with her "employee of the year" award, Mireille quietly accepted saying, "I love my job and I love my patients." For that devotion, she was presented with a \$500 check, a trophy and the admiration of her co-workers.

Workforce Connection in Talks

Workforce Connection in talks to modify green jobs training grant

(OCALA, FL) Feb. 15, 2011— Workforce Connection announced today it is recommending changes to a federal grantsupported green jobs program in an effort to better serve those who have already received training.

That means focusing on placement and other services for the 333 graduates of the West Ocala Green Jobs training program rather than adding more trainees to the program.

Workforce Connection CEO Rusty Skinner said that despite best efforts, the green jobs training program, funded by a \$2.9-million United States Department of Labor Pathways Out of Poverty grant, has been stymied by the continued slump in the economy as well as "a number of insurmountable challenges ... totally outside our control."

Skinner said the organization is working with DOL to develop a transition plan which will include job placement services as well as return to DOL of unused grant dollars. Pathways partners, contracted to provide training, have been notified of pending changes.

According to Kathleen Woodring, Workforce Connection's chief operating officer, the move to modify the grant was a "business decision just as we've always done with all of our funding sources."

"When you've trained enough, it's time to move on ... and work on the returns now to have it turn out good in the end," Woodring said, adding, "We're also trying to be good stewards of tax dollars."

Workforce Connection submitted the grant in September 2009 after a pilot project garnered wide industry support in the design and development of recruitment criteria and curriculum. The program's goal was to reduce unemployment in the area's poorest communities while promoting small business development.

Skinner said that, in addition to the stalled economy, one of the factors that hampered small business' anticipated green jobs expansion was confusion over Florida's solar tax credit program, which at one point was cut by the state legislature.

"None of the problems with the grant are attributable to a lack of effort," Skinner said. "(But) to continue this grant under these conditions would be like Ford deciding to continue making the Edsel after nobody wanted to buy it."

Long-Term Care: Planning for the Future

It's nearing tax time, and that's a good time to think about financial planning. And when you make financial plans, don't forget to include long-term care needs you or your spouse might have in the future.

Long-term care is expensive, and Medicare does not cover the costs. And there are other reasons to plan ahead, to learn about your options for care before you need help. That way, if you need care suddenly, you and your family won't have to scramble. Equally important, you won't end up in a nursing home just because no one knew alternatives were available.

Long-term care isn't only about nursing homes. There are many options for care and support that can help you stay at home longer or even avoid a nursing home altogether. The "home- and community-based services" that can help you stay at home range from homemaker help, such as help preparing meals, to care provided by health professionals like nurses, and a lot in between: personal attendants can help you with daily activities and adult day services and respite services can give family caregivers a needed rest. You may want training to learn new skills if, for example, you start having vision trouble, or perhaps home modifications can help you get around your house better so you can keep living at home.


What services are available will depend on where you live. Many seniors rely on state programs, like Medicaid, for their care. In states whose Medicaid programs invest more on home- and community-based services, there are generally more of these services available for everyone-even for people who don't use Medicaid.


The good news is that the Affordable Care Act-the new health care law-includes several new programs that will help people who need long-term care stay at home longer. New programs will give states financial incentives to expand the home- and community-based services they offer. Educational grants will ensure that there is an adequate, and adequately trained, workforce to provide home care as the population ages. Starting in 2014, the spouse of someone receiving care at home will be protected from having to spend all the couple's assets in order for their husband or wife to qualify for Medicaid; today, that protection exists only if the person needing care is in a nursing home.

The law also includes a new voluntary federal long-term care insurance program, Community Living Assistance Services and Supports (CLASS), that will help pay for care. CLASS will be available to working adults, regardless of age or health, probably in 2013. To be eligible for benefits, you'll first need to be enrolled for five years. After that, if you need long-term care, the program will provide an average benefit of at least \$50 a day (\$18,250 a year), adjusted for inflation. You can use that money to pay for assistance or other things you need to help you stay in your home. The program pays as long as you need care.

You still need to do your homework-plan your finances and learn what's available where you live. The Administration on Aging's ElderCare Locator, at 1-800-677-1116 or www.eldercare.gov, can help you find services in your community.

You can learn more about the new options in the long-term services section of Families USA's website, at www.familiesusa. org. And you need to keep an eye on what becomes available in your area. Because of health reform, there should be more choices that will help you stay at home.


