Aircraft crash lands at Ocala International Airport

Aircraft crash lands at Ocala International Airport

(OCALA, FL) April 21, 2011 The pilot of an aircraft told fire officials the plane lost electrical power, before making an emergency landing at the Ocala International Airport this morning. The pilot, Bill Evans, told authorities that the landing gear collapsed on touchdown. He was flying the 1992 Beechcraft Bonanza plane from Bradenton Florida to West Virginia when the loss of electrical power occurred. Fortunately he was not in-

jured. Ocala Fire Rescue responded with several pieces of emergency apparatus including the Airport Rescue Firefighting (A.R.F.F.) truck. The control tower at the airport notified firefighters of an aircraft in trouble at 10:29 a.m., and they arrived on scene within three minutes. Runway 36 E was temporarily closed and the Federal Aviation Administration (F.A.A.) was notified. Firefighters remained on scene for almost three hours.

dents were put upon because someone was always asking for more money. His quote was "It's all about money." This reader had a house in Spruce Creek also but had not mentioned anything about Spruce Creek. I'm sure they have there problems also.

I believe the Villages is one of the most exciting, beautiful places in the state for active seniors. If you are going to move somewhere to vegetate the Villages is not really the place to go. They have 100's of events daily. Just don't talk politics. Over the years I have been publisher I have received letters and calls from people who had been bullied, uninvited to community affairs and, well, you get the idea. Does the Villages have an exclusive on the political things? (Strong ideas we'll call it) The answer is no. Every gated community is the same about politics because the politicians use them for voting blocks, spreading rumors about their opponent, or promising something they never are going to do. I have had many letters from Marion County gated communities where residents were arguing about politics. If you live in a gated community? My message to you would be relax. You are there to have fun and retire.

In my early days, 9 years old, I wrote and presented a speech at a local Optimist Club and won. After that, I went to state three times in the next few years. The real treat was going to nationals in Cuba. I met Bat-

esta and Castro was fighting in the hills. In Havana where I stayed, at the Hotel National there were machine guns set up behind sand bags and military police everywhere. As far as the eye could see there were sand bags and machine guns. Actually, the military Police saved me from being robbed the second night we were there. That is another story. Cuba had its own young speaker. I think by this time I was about fourteen. We were competing against some eighteen year competitors who very polished. 

The Ombudsman Program Withlacoochee area volunteers continue to advocate for residents who live in long-term care facilities. It is our pleasure to serve this population and assist them with any problems they may have. This month our council has had the opportunity to do several annual assessments at long-term care facilities. We announce our visits upon arrival, and spend time speaking with residents. It is a joy to spend quality time with each individual and

give them an opportunity for their voices to be heard. To explain the process further, the assessment process reviews conditions in a facility from a resident's perspective, focusing on conditions that impact the health, safety, welfare and rights of residents with the purpose of noting possible areas of concern and making recommendations to enhance the quality of life for residents. This is why we volunteer! We have the opportunity every time we enter a long-term care facility

to enhance the quality of life for residents! Florida law mandates that the administrative assessment shall not duplicate the efforts of agency surveys and inspections to the extent possible and reasonable. In order to focus on residents and prevent duplication to the extent possible, we interview a cross-section of residents, record the residents' comments anonymously, and bring these comments to the administrator's attention. Our assessment information is public record. Consumers can request this information when considering long-term care options for themselves or their loved ones. You can request this information by calling toll-free

1-888-831-0404 and speaking to your local ombudsman office.

We are looking for more volunteers to identify, investigate and resolve residents' concerns. Special training and certification is provided. We need you! 

(OCALA, FL) A civilian reportedly stopped by the Paddock Branch of the Ocala Post Office and found smoke coming from the building, located at 4545 Southwest 60th Avenue. Firefighters were notified and responded a few minutes before 9 p.m., and arrived on scene three minutes later at 9:01 p.m. Ocala firefighters found smoke throughout the building, and contained flames to a small area inside the rear of the structure. 



2. **STIR** cookie mix and melted butter with fork until crumbs form. Press evenly in bottom of prepared pan. Bake 12 to 15 minutes or until lightly browned.

3. **BEAT** cream cheese in medium bowl with electric mixer on medium speed until smooth. Beat in eggs just until blended. Beat in sweetened condensed milk, vanilla and 2 tablespoons

pineapple juice. Pour over warm crust. Sprinkle drained pineapple evenly over top.

4. **STIR** coconut, macadamia nuts and butter in small bowl until evenly moistened. Sprinkle over pineapple layer.

5. **BAKE** 30 to 35 minutes or until filling is set and coconut is lightly browned. Cool 1 hour on wire rack. Chill 1 hour. Cut into bars.
