The Dow – The year after a Presidential Election

We have now moved through another presidential election year. I

thought it would be interesting to see how the Dow Jones Industrial Average (the Dow) has performed in the year following a presidential election.

Beginning in 1900 we have had 29 presidential elections. Interestingly enough, 15 of those presidential elections were won by a Republican and 14 were won by a Democrat. A Republican, Ronald Reagan, received the most electoral votes in an election with 525 in 1984. While a Democrat, Barack Obama, received the most popular votes in an election with over 69 million in 2008.

The relatively even splits don't just end with the political parties. Since the 1900 presidential election there have been 28 post election years of full returns for the Dow. Over that span 14 years have brought positive returns and 14 years have been negative for the Dow. The largest positive post election year for the Dow since 1900 was 1933 with a return of +66.8% (not including divi-

dends). The largest negative post election year for the Dow since 1900 was 1937 with a return of -32.8% (not including dividends). The average return for the 28 years was a positive +5.49% (not including dividends).

So what does all of this mean for the Dow in 2013? The Dow is off to a good start so far this year with a positive return of +7.31% as of 2/27/2013. But tune in next month as we provide our first quarter update and overview of the markets.

The Sheriff's Citizens Academy and Partnership (CAP) program will be a free educational course about the operations of the Marion County Sheriff's Office. This 14-week course will meet weekly and highlight all units within the Sheriff's Office, giving citizens an in-depth understanding of what the agency is doing for the community. Just about a month ago, the new Property Crimes, Fugitive Apprehension and Tactical Investigations teams were formed to reduce crime in Marion County. This new plan will allow deputies to concentrate on patrolling every neighborhood; and give Major Crimes detectives more time to work homicides and sex crimes.

One of the biggest headlines, recently, was the double homicide at the Vacation Host Inn on South Pine Avenue. You know the details: Kelvin Coleman, 37, is accused of shooting and killing two innocent motel workers. Here are details not mentioned in the media reporting of this case. Our professionals were able to get a solid identification of the suspect, get information on what he was driving, where he was most likely to go and put handcuffs on him within 52 minutes of the first 911 call.

There is a good chance you heard about "Operation Reveal the Deal," the criminal case against the controversial nonprofit Allied Veterans of the World that operates strip-mall casinos along SR 200. What you probably don't know, is Marion County

Sheriff's Office assisted the forces of the United States Secret Service, Internal Revenue Service and the Florida Department of Law Enforcement in serving warrants at three internet cafes in Marion County.

We've been searching for Thomas Edward Mascaro, 64, who lives in the Oak Run subdivision. Mascaro simply vanished. We put together a team of more than 60 people to search at least four times for Mascaro. We had volunteers on horses, plus experienced hikers and bicyclists came out to help. As of today, Mascaro has not been located; But, we're still looking him.

Expansion of Medicaid: Is More Always Better?

As the 2013 Legislative Session fires up, several issues are catapulting their way to the forefront of attention. Few of which, however, have equaled the pub-

licity of the Legislature's decision regarding the expansion of Florida's Medicaid program under the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, more commonly known as ObamaCare. Although the Affordable Care Act is the federal overhaul of the healthcare system, the U.S. Supreme Court has allowed each state to decide whether or not to expand their state's Medicaid program based on the individual needs of their citizens.

It is predicted that by expanding Medicaid to cover incomes up to 138 percent of the

federal poverty level, Florida will add up to 1.3 million people to Medicaid coverage, at a cost of \$3.8 billion over the next ten years. However, estimates show that 82 percent of the expansion population are not children, disabled individuals, or even the elderly; they are able-bodied adults. We need to create solutions that help families move towards independence and self-sustainment, rather than continue to enable government dependence as a way of means.

Florida's Medicaid program is a vital safety net for millions of Floridians and their families. We must carefully proceed to determine what unintended consequences may arise from any course taken. For example, by allowing the expansion of Medicaid, we would become reliant on the funding from the federal government who has been unable to balance a budget for years. If they are ultimately unable to fund this expansion, the costs will fall onto the shoulders of the same families who we are intending to protect.

We must also seriously analyze the program's ability to provide quality care and remain affordable. Our current Medicaid program is weak at best. Even with coverage, many families find it hard to receive appropriate and timely care. If we were to allow the expansion to take place, Florida simply does not have enough doctors to serve all

their new patients, which severely affects the quality of patient care.

As Florida House Speaker Will Weatherford recently stated, "The state has an obligation to investigate and pursue viable alternatives that will be in the best interest of all Floridians. And that's exactly what we're doing in the Florida House."


