### MOST EFFECTIVE RETURN TO WORK PROGRAM AWARD

Sheriff Chris Blair and the Marion County Sheriff's Office has been awarded the Florida Sheriffs Risk Management Fund (FS-RMF) Loss Control Annual Safety Award in 2014 for their "Most Effective Return to Work Program."

The Award was announced at the Florida Sheriffs Association 2014 Summer Conference. Executive Director David F. Harvey of the FSRMF came to the Marion County Sheriff's Office to personally present the plaque to Sheriff Blair and the Human Resource staff.

The FSRMF awarded the Marion County Sheriff's Office, who is a participant in the Florida Sheriffs Workers' Compensation

Self-Insurance Program, with recognition for having the "Most Effective Return to Work Program" for injured employees. In presenting the award Sheriff Harvey said, "There are two components used to determine the recipient of this award. First, losses over the most recent three year period are reviewed and the recipient of this award has one the lowest average lost days from work due to occupational accident and injury for that time period. Second, efforts to get employees back to work and practices with regard to treatment of employees are reviewed and evaluated and given consideration for this award."

Sheriff Blair credits his HR staff and the constant review process put in place for lost days from work.

## Just In Time Machine Slated to Locate in Ocala

OCALA, Fla. – Today, Governor Rick Scott announced Just In Time (JIT) Machining, LLC, will locate its new production facility in Ocala. The company's first Florida facility will create 25 manufacturing jobs and a capital investment of at least \$3.2 million.

Governor Scott said, "Just In Time's decision to locate its new production facility

in Ocala is great news for Florida families. Every job positively impacts a family, and these 25 new jobs will allow more Floridians to provide for their families and live the American Dream. Last year, we rolled back the sales tax on manufacturing equipment and machinery for Florida's manufacturing companies like JIT. Since December 2010, we've created 620,300 private-sector jobs

and we will continue working to create opportunities for each Floridian that wants a job."

Since its founding in 1996, JIT has applied its focus on being a full-service, family-owned, CNC or automated machinery shop providing prototyping, CNC and CNC-turn mill machining, drilling, milling, turning and sawing, welding and metal fabrication. The production facility will serve the company's southeast customers. JIT chose Ocala over Georgia, Alabama, and Texas because of Ocala's workforce, CNC skills training program, central location, and

Florida's low cost of doing business. President and CEO of JIT, Kelly Alexander said, "We have found Ocala and the state of Florida to be an ideal location for our new manufacturing facility. Ocala's central location, I-75 access, and a developed manufacturing workforce make it an idea location to serve our customers in the southeastern United States."

Florida's advanced manufacturing industries are diverse and include sectors producing intermediate and finished products ranging from plastics to tortillas and motor

Do you know what Amendment 2 really says about pot?

This amendment, despite being promoted as a compassionate effort to legalize marijuana for medical purposes, should be re-

jected — regardless of one's position on the issue of medical marijuana.

Voters are being led to believe that medical marijuana could only be used for "debilitating diseases." But the full text of the amendment allows the use of marijuana for

virtually any medical condition at the discretion of any recommending physician, and no actual prescription is required.

Does this belong in the constitution?

When proposed amendments are placed on the ballot, voters only see a ballot title and ballot summary written by the amendment sponsors. Most voters don't have the time or inclination to read the full text of the actual amendment, much less study its impact. The impact of this amendment is potentially devastating.

If Amendment 2 is approved, it would be almost impossible to fix its many flaws because it would be enshrined in the Constitution, it will not be a general law that can be changed or improved by the Florida Leg-

islature as needed to respond to the laundry list of inevitable problems. In addition, with passage into the Constitution the Attorney General would be forced to protect and enforce this law.

Laws such as this would greatly benefit from the review process that is available from passage through the legislature. Being able to address and revise issues as they arise and are identified is extremely necessary and would be much more effective than relying on rules created by the Department of Health.

The Florida Department of Health estimates that if Amendment 2 passes, there will be approximately 250,000 caregivers and nearly 1,800 pot shops that would dispense marijuana. This calls into question the state's ability to adequately regulate the distribution of marijuana, since it would not be obtained from traditional pharmacies, but

from shops run by the marijuana industry.

Do you want your children smoking pot? Amendment 2 is so broad and vague it will undoubtedly open the door to the general use of marijuana, not the carefully regulated medical use of a drug for those truly suffering.

Under amendment 2, teenagers and children, of any age, will be allowed to legally purchase marijuana without their parents' permission. As a father and grandfather, this is the most terrifying part of Amendment 2.

Additionally, Amendment 2 places no restrictions on the location of seedy pot shops. Don't be surprised if "pot docs" spring up next to restaurants, churches, schools, and supermarkets just as the "pill mills" did not so long ago. Nowhere in their amendment do they list criteria to prohibit sales anywhere. Alcohol sales are prohibited within certain distances from schools, but there is no regulation for the proximity of pot shops to schools. Do you want pot shops opening next door or across the street from your child's school?

## CEP News

Apollo Renal Therapeutics

Apollo Renal Therapeutics, LLC, recently announced they are locating their headquarters and manufacturing facility in Ocala. The company was created to commercialize novel proprietary products that enhance patient care. One such venture is a new artificial kidney (dialyzer) to treat kidney failure. The development of the dialyzer has been funded by the National Institutes of Health as a Small Business Technology Transfer grant, in conjunction with the Washington, DC, VA Medical Center. In the US, more than 350,000 patients rely on kidney dialysis to survive and this new device

is designed to increase efficiency compared to existing therapies. In addition to commercializing the new dialysis device, Apollo Renal Therapeutics, LLC has a number of projects in various stages of development.

Artemis Plastics, LLC, the contract manufacturing division, will continue to serve the customers of the former Clairson Plastics company, which includes retail, industrial and medical device injection molding and assembly. The company also plans to expand their contract manufacturing services to other companies with plastic injection molding needs.

The company will create more than 20 jobs initially at wages well above the targeted threshold of 15% above the county average.

JIT Machining, based in Rochester, NY, is locating its third facility in a 25,000 sq. ft. facility along I-75 just north of the Ocala city limits. JIT does extensive work with the aerospace and aviation industries which is one of the CEP's targeted industry sectors. The company will be investing more than \$3 million and creating 25 jobs which exceed the area's wage targets.

Since its founding in 1996, JIT has ap-

plied its focus on being a full-service, family-owned, CNC shop providing prototyping, CNC and CNC-turn mill machining, drilling, milling, turning and sawing, welding and metal fabrication. The production facility will serve the company's southeast customers. JIT chose Ocala over Georgia, Alabama, and Texas because of Ocala's workforce, CNC skills training program, central location, and Florida's low cost of doing business.



## Governor Rick Scott FROM THE GOVERNOR'S DESK

Gov. Scott: "Federal Officials Need to Reverse Course on Their Denial of Waiver for English Learners and Florida Schools"

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. – Governor Scott and Commissioner Pam Stewart sent a letter calling on for federal education officials to reverse course on their decision to deny Florida's request to exempt English Learners (EL) from new federal accountability regulations. The letter gives federal officials 30 days to reverse their decision and end their attempt to micro-manage Florida's schools. Florida stands ready to review legal options should they refuse.

Governor Scott said, "Today, we're putting the bureaucrats in Washington on notice: reverse course on our English Learner waiver, or we'll begin reviewing every legal avenue that's available to us. Our districts have done an incredible job in providing our children with a quality education, and this federal overreach will punish Florida schools for their diversity."

Commissioner Pam Stewart said, "Florida's teachers and students have made tremendous gains using our policy, and that continued success should not be jeopardized by an approach that is inflexible and that disregards Florida's expertise in educating its own children. Florida should be able to continue operating with our long-standing policy."

In developing Florida's revised account-

ability system, local education leaders and parents determined how it made sense to count the test scores of English Learners. This policy was codified into Florida law this year, and now federal Education Secretary Arne Duncan refused to approve this student-centered practice.

Florida is a national leader in educating English Learners. With more than 265,000 EL students, Florida has a remarkable track record. Florida's English Learners have increased grade level performance by 154 percent from 2001 to 2010. In myriad rankings, Florida has been a leader in closing the achievement gap for English Learners.

TALLAHASSEE — Governor Rick Scott announced that Florida created 23,000 private-sector jobs in August 2014. Since December 2010, Florida's private-sector businesses have added 643,100 jobs for Florida families. Florida's annual job growth rate has exceeded the nation's rate since April 2012.

Governor Rick Scott said, "Today's announcement of 23,000 private-sector jobs being created in Florida over the month of August is great news for Florida families. As we continue to create an opportunity economy and a business-friendly environment, we are seeing more jobs being created through-

out Florida communities. Since December 2010, we have created more than 643,000 private-sector jobs, and we will continue to work so that every Floridian who wants a job can get one."

The statewide unemployment rate for August 2014 is 6.3 percent, down 0.8 percentage point from the August 2013 rate. Since December 2010, Florida's unemployment rate has dropped 4.8 percentage points, from 11.1 percent down now to 6.3 percent in August 2014.

Department of Economic Opportunity Executive Director Jesse Panuccio said, "The creation of 23,000 private-sector jobs in Florida last month is another strong chapter in Florida's economic turnaround story. With measurable growth last month in the manufacturing and business and professional services industries, we can see that our efforts to foster the creation of high-skill, high-wage jobs are paying off for Florida families."

The long-term positive trends in the unemployment rate and job counts are among the most important economic indicators to consider when analyzing the health of Florida's economic recovery. The state's private-sector job counts have been steadily on the rise for over four years, showing that Florida's businesses are responding to the state's improving economic climate. Since December 2010, the state has added 643,100 private-sector jobs.

More Floridians Getting Back to Work

Florida's annual job growth rate has exceeded that of the nation since April 2012.

Florida's private sector job growth month-to-month has been positive for 42 of the last 45 months.

Florida has created 643,100 new private sector jobs since December 2010.

Florida job postings compiled by the Help Wanted OnLine data series from The Conference Board showed 273,281 openings in August 2014.

Home Sales Robust

Home sales remain robust as the backlog of existing homes on the market is down by 33.4 percent from December 2011 (Florida Realtors).

Florida median home prices were up 3.6 percent over the year in July 2014.

Economic Growth Trends Up Across State

A recent U.S. Census Survey reported that Florida experienced an influx of people moving into the state. Florida also led the nation in migrations from Puerto Rico.

Florida is running a trade surplus of over \$18 billion – with \$90.4 billion in exports and \$71.8 billion in imports in 2012, up from \$86.8 billion in exports in 2011 and \$62.4 billion in imports in 2011.

Workforce Boards Assisting in Employment

In August, Florida's 24 Regional Workforce Boards reported more than 38,400 Floridians were placed in jobs. An individual who receives employment and training assistance through a CareerSource Center and finds a job within 180 days is deemed a placement and may be reported by a region-


