Our website and social media are being populated with in-house videos and starting in April, the CEP will be producing a weekly videocast highlighting CEP news, partner news, and community stories. Earthquake in Florida

It is said by seismic activity specialist the quakes could be related to natural or human activity but did not confirm or deny that they were connected to oil drilling in the area.

Local meteorologist provided earthquake coverage said they had been in contact with USGS geophysicists, and that it is next to impossible that oil drilling or fracking directly caused the earthquakes.

"Our area lies along a normally inactive fault line known as the Bahama Fracture Zone. Earthquakes generally don't happen along this fault. Seeing minor activity like this is not uncommon. It happened about 30 years ago. We are told they are part of normal seismic activity."

Sandy Ebersole, who heads the division of the Geological Survey of Alabama that documents and studies earthquakes, said it's not uncommon to have multiple small-scale earthquakes back-to-back.

"We do have episodes of this kind of seismic activity clusters once in a while," Ebersole said in the article. "That's normal seismic activity for our area."

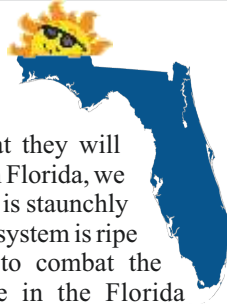

Wade in 1973, it has been estimated that there have been over 60 million legal abortions in the United States. Even just one is heart wrenching enough for me, but to think that we have extinguished the lives of millions of our own offspring is devastating.

This year, in New York and Virginia, we have seen the far left liberals, under the guise of being "progressive", take some of the most extreme positions on abortion law that is nothing short of infanticide. However, I am optimistic that these radical proposals are beginning to further open the

SB 792, also known as the "Heartbeat Bill", is the legislation that your Senator has filed for this year. Along with a companion bill in the House, filed by Rep. Hill, this legislation would prohibit the termination of a pregnancy once a fetal heartbeat can be detected. SB 792 also requires a physician to perform an examination for, and inform a woman seeking to obtain an abortion of the presence of a fetal heartbeat. I think that this legislation is one that the left fears the most, because it is so real, simple, and convincing. In the history of humankind, the heartbeat has always been the clear signal that life is present. It is a signal that connects us so well to our own human emotion and conscience, because it can be physically seen, felt and heard.

SB 1774, known as the "Parental Consent for Abortion Act", filed by Senator Stargel, prohibits a physician from performing an abortion on a minor unless the physician has been presented with consent from the minor's parent or guardian. Your Senator as

also co-sponsored this bill.

SB 558, the "Florida Pain-Capable Unborn Child Protection Act" filed by Senator Joe Gruters, prohibits a physician from performing the abortion of an unborn child that is deemed capable of feeling of pain. In the bill, an unborn child is defined as being pain capable at 20 weeks post-fertilization.

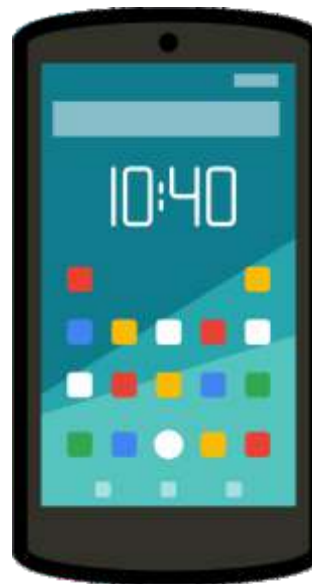

What exactly is the Federal Reserve and why is the United States in perpetual debt with itself?

The Fed, simply the United States' central bank, was created in 1913 by the Federal Reserve Act under President Woodrow Wilson. The Fed is independent from the government as far as "ownership", but was established by Congress as a means to end the stronghold of private bankers. That's the official, short historical origin.

A more sinister version purports it was created out of pure greed by private bankers themselves after President Andrew Jackson closed down the (second) Bank of the United States and America was not only debt-free, but ran a surplus. Naturally this was problematic for bankers, so a devious scheme was hatched to undermine the president and create mistrust by the American people.

It is thought the financial crisis of 1907 stemmed from a rumor by J.P. Morgan against one of his competitors. This created a domino effect when people rushed the banks, demanding back their funds and sending the stock market into dangerous waters. In order to right the ship, both political parties agreed that the system needed to be reformed. Enter the creation of the National Monetary Commission. The Chairman of the newly formed Commission, ironically the father-in-law of J.D. Rockefeller, invited seven individuals, under an oath of secrecy, to a "duck hunting" retreat at Jekyll Island, Georgia. These special guests included a senior partner from

J.P. Morgan and a representative of the Rothschild banking dynasty in Europe. Coincidence?

Consider the phrase "If you can't beat them, join them." These competing private bankers banded together and drafted a Congressional bill to enact the Federal Reserve Act. This bill was conveniently presented when most of Congress had already left for Christmas break, leaving just a handful of Senators to vote. Not surprising it was unanimously passed. Congress was duped by the very people they were trying to disallow, and today America is \$22 trillion in debt to the successors of these bankers, or in short, the Fed.

America's debt grew exponentially after 2009 when the economy collapsed and the Fed bailed out big banks across the country, essentially preserving their own family fortunes. There are deeper layers associated with the founders' actions, such as media manipulation for massive programming, warmongering, and other nefarious motives, but that will be another story for another day.

There are still people today who want to abolish the Fed and return to the Gold Standard, but this would be a mammoth and exercise. John F. Kennedy actually tried to back U.S. currency with silver in June of 1963 (Executive Order 11110, and we all know how that story sadly ends...coincidentally.

Until such a day America can escape the Fed's restraint, give your bank a second look. Believe it or not, there are banks that survived the economic collapse without asking for, or using, Federal bailout funds. These small, community banks are who I

trust and with whom I choose to do business. As a small dot on the American canvas, I have no power to change history or enact change, but I can support those who didn't fall prey to the metastatic corruption of an oppressive entity and its gluttonous architects.

The Opioid Crisis

From Attorney General Moody

Ending the opioid crisis in Florida is a top priority of our office, and this week, we received great news from the Florida Legislature. A bill to create the Statewide Task Force on Opioid Drug Abuse passed its first committee. The Senate Health Policy Committee voted 10-0 in favor of SB 1658.

The following day, the House companion bill, HB 875, passed the House Criminal Justice Subcommittee without a single no vote. There is not a corner of the state that has not felt the grave effects of the opioid crisis. Establishing a statewide task force solely focused on stopping opioid abuse is vital to our mission of combating the crisis and saving lives.

Florida's Statewide Task Force on Opioid Drug Abuse would:

- Study the cost of the crisis on state and local governments;
- Identify available programs that have been successful in combating opioid abuse;
- Work to better understand the sources of addiction;
- Explore whether there is need for additional regulatory activity; and, among other things,
- Evaluate and identify ways to reduce the demand for opioids and decrease the supply.

I want to thank the House and Senate this week for their hard work. And, I will continue each day fighting to end the opioid epidemic.

Product Label Changes



Major Changes Headed To A Product Label Near You

(NAPSI)—If you're like 90 percent of shoppers, you consult the Nutrition Facts panel on food packages before you buy. To make it easier to make informed food choices, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has developed a new Nutrition Facts label. Here are the seven

major new features:

1. Increased print size for "Calories."

Calorie counts will be easier to see.

2. Inclusion of "Added Sugars."

The FDA currently defines *added sugars* as "sugars that are either added during the processing of foods, or are packaged as such, and include sugars (free, mono- and disaccharides), sugars from syrups and honey, and sugars from concentrated fruit or vegetable juices that are in excess of what would be expected from the same volume of 100 percent fruit or vegetable juice of the same type." Sugar alcohols, or polyols, provide sweetness but aren't counted as "added sugars" because they're not sugar. These low-digestible carbohydrates can replace sugar as a lower-calorie alternative. Common polyols include erythritol, maltitol, sorbitol, mannitol, xylitol, lactitol, isomalt and hydrogenated starch

hydrolysates.

3. Changing "Sugars" to "Total Sugars."

Sugar can be present in healthy foods. This change can help consumers understand the amount of sugar the product contains from any source.

4. Removal of "Calories from Total Fat."

Research shows the *type* of fat (for example, polyunsaturated) is more important than the total calories from fat. Labels still include "Total Fat," "Saturated Fat" and "Trans Fat."

5. Increased print size for "Serving Size" and "Servings per Package/Container."

Portion control remains a problem for many. Increased visibility of recommended serving sizes can help people make better, more accurate decisions.

6. The amounts of vitamin D and potassium are now required, instead of vitamins A and C.

Based on research from the Institute of Medicine, the new labels will include this information to increase visibility of vitamin D and potassium requirements. Though voluntary, similar information for vitamins A and C may still be included.

7. Revision of "Percent Daily Value" Footnote.

The new language will specifically state: "The % Daily Value tells you how much a nutrient in a serving of food contributes to a daily diet. 2,000 calories a day is used for general nutrition advice." Experts at the Calorie Control Council, a nonprofit association that seeks to provide objective, science-based communications about low-calorie foods and beverages, suggest that

this revision may help clarify the meaning of "Daily Value".

pollinators. This spring, the grant will fund the renovation of an older butterfly garden, broadening it to serve more pollinators by planting native wildflowers and installing "pocket beds" of annual flower species. Students across grade levels will participate in plant selection, plant rearing and garden design.

"There is nothing more powerful in education than student voice," wrote Vicky Prusinski, science specialist at The Orchard School. "Funding for this project quite literally allows my students to put their money where their mouths are and do what they passionately feel compelled to do."

Agriculture-Focused Camp Programs

Gateway to the Arctic Camp outside of Talkeetna, Alaska, also got a Feed a Bee grant to provide hands-on education for young people. The nonprofit teaches campers the significance of serving those in need and the value of hard work through fun activities involving sustainability, farming and environmental stewardship. For years, the camp planted wildflowers to attract pollinators to its 3 acres of gardens, and this summer it will dedicate an entire field as forage for native bees and other pollinators. Campers of all abilities, including those with special needs, can discover the connection between bees and the crops they pollinate. The Feed a Bee program celebrates this program not only because of its commendable mission but because the organization's grant meant Feed a Bee met its goal of funding forage for pollinators in all 50 states.

Since 2015, Feed a Bee has distributed more than 3 billion wildflower seeds nationwide and provided grants to 163 organizations in efforts to increase forage and, perhaps most importantly, to teach kids the importance of bees.

Raising Kids Who Speak For The Bees

(NAPSI)—Remember the Lorax, who spoke for the trees? Dr. Seuss' tale laid important groundwork by encouraging the next generation to care about the environment. As Seuss wrote, "Unless someone like you cares a whole awful lot, nothing is going to get better. It's not." Regardless of age or ability, students who care "a whole awful lot" can become some of bees' best advocates.

With pollinators facing challenges including a lack of forage (food) that provides them with proper nutrition and habitat, we have a great opportunity to empower the next generation to "speak for the bees" and give them the tools to help.

Impact Beyond the Classroom

When kindergartners at The Orchard School in Indianapolis learned they wouldn't have chocolate without pollinators, what began as a snack time discussion led to a burning desire to help. Their curriculum model allowed students to work together to plant and maintain a pollinator-attractant garden, which more than 15 species visit regularly. To further this student-driven impact, the school applied for funding through the Bayer Feed a Bee program, which provides grants to create forage areas to feed bees and other

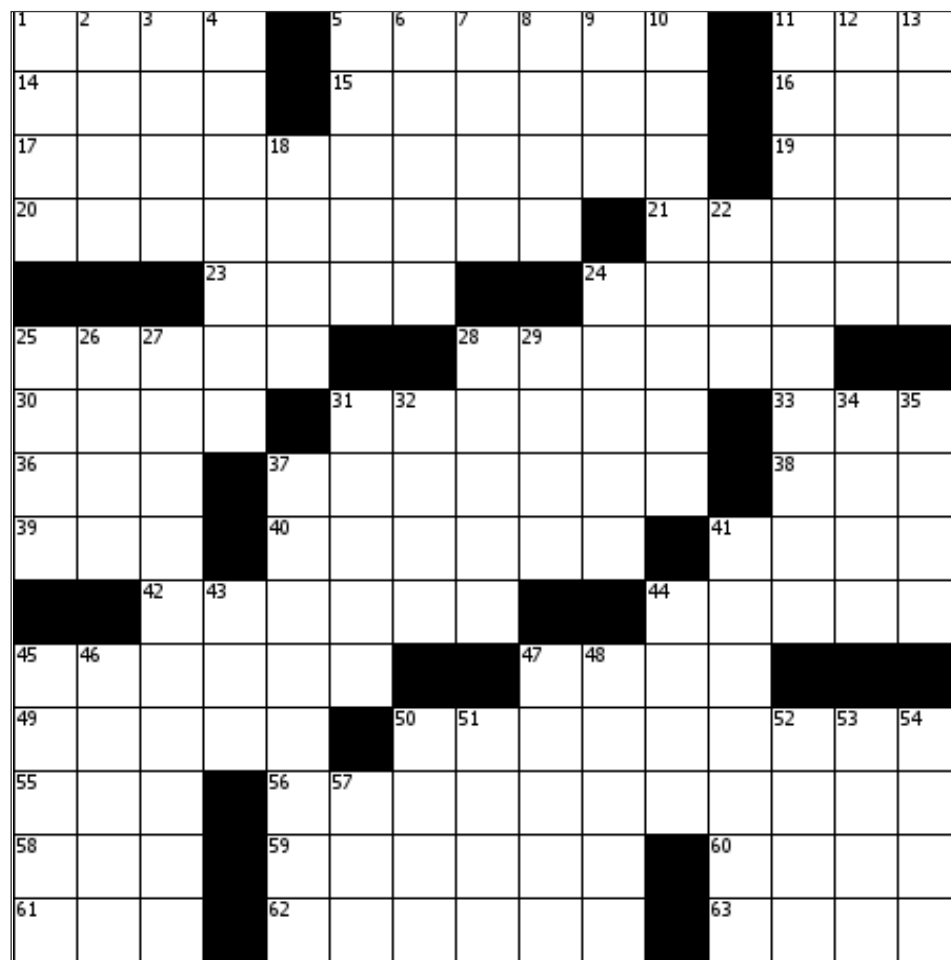

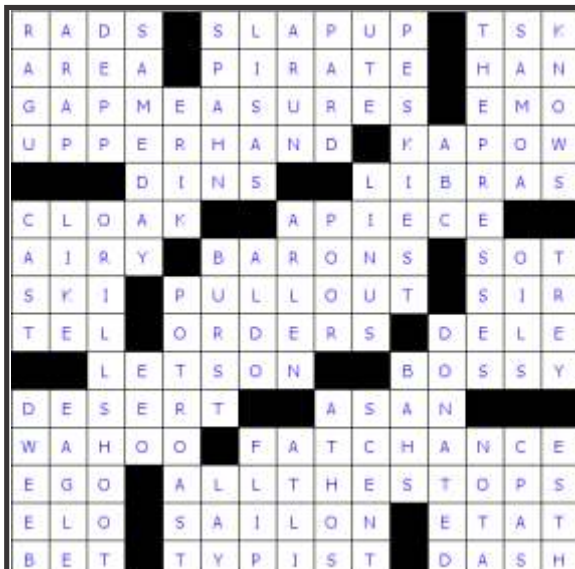
