The businesses will need to submit an online application demonstrating the negative impact of COVID-19 and will be able to receive up to \$15,000.

Moving Forward Program - The Moving Forward Program seeks to assist businesses with 26-100 employees who have been experiencing continuing negative impacts as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic.

The businesses will need to submit an online application demonstrating the negative impact of COVID19 and will be

able to borrow up to \$40,000.

Testing Capacity Enhancement Grant - The Testing Capacity Enhancement Grant program seeks to assist private labs, clinics, and physician offices which are looking to increase their testing capacity. Business may apply one time for a reimbursement of up to \$30,000 for expenses which demonstrate their intention to increase their testing capacity beyond what was previously available.

Preparing for the Future Grant Program - The Preparing for the Future Grant Program seeks to assist businesses who are working to address needs to directly combat COVID-19.

The business will need to submit a business plan which outlines how this business is addressing pandemic related needs and proof of financing.

The business will be able to receive up to \$3,000 per job to be created up to \$300,000.

Project Operating Safely (PPE Reimbursement Program) - Project

Operating Safely will provide up to \$3,000 in reimbursements to local businesses with fewer than 100 employees for the

purchase of necessary personal protective equipment (PPE) and other health and safety-related items and services; businesses with more than 100 employees are eligible to be reimbursed up to \$10,000. Businesses may apply once for a reimbursement and funds will be allocated on a first come, first serve basis. The entire application process will be completed online.

He said I don't want to tell anyone, let's just do this. I'll play golf as long as I can and write. We did just that. Robert played golf for six or seven months, wrote three story per month, on the eighth month I received notification that he had passed away.

The last story wrote he said to me... You can tell the story if I wanted too. I ran his stories for a year all unseen unread stories from my file. Then I picked out some of my favorite stories from the past and ran them for another year.

It made me feel special that he would ask me and trust me with his stories.

We have been advertising a cart in our papers. It's called the CLAX not sure what the named means. I received one and it is really handy. It was easy to put together I assembled it in minutes.. I pushed one button and it opened up to a cart. It's very light and is very handy. I have used for laundry, carrying newspapers, outdoor market shopping, carrying things. When you are through using it push one button and it folds up into nothing . You should really take a look at this cart.

Famous people I have met... Actually when I was very young a hundred years ago... I grew up about three blocks from the Barefoot Artist. We ran around together as kids. His name was Harry Guy LaBree and he hardly ever wore shoes. They sent him home one day for not wearing shoes. He had holes in his means (hand me down) Long hair before any of the other kids in school. I went snake hunting and alligator watching before there were laws about catching alligators. One day my new bicycle got stolen while Harry and I were sneaking up on alligators. Harry said thats why I don't have a new bike. They don't get stolen as often.

Harry became friend with some of the Seminole Indians in Dania Elementary School where he went to school and lived. He would later visited the reservation in Hollywood Florida. We went to school with the seminole Indian students 1 thru eighth. Jimmy Jumper / One of the Osceolas, Tank Bowers, Judy Osceola, Princess Pracila Doctor. Harry was always drawing people, faces, animals and etc. Later in life he would become the Artist hired to do a lot of the tribal artistry. He hand painted the chief and the trial leaders.

I tracked him down and called him on the phone. We talked for a long time, he lived near a swamp. He had a mobile home tucked in behind a Cypress head. He had his same wife, his girlfriend from middle school. He

quit school early and worked some jobs. He decided to go to Australia. They were advertising great opportunity and the wild country intrigued him. He said that was an adventure but he was promised a job that did was not real. He found another job and worked their way back to the states.

He past away a few years ago but he left some fond memories for me. I have a lot of stories about him but I say Google him he was a great artist! Harry Guy LaBree The Barefoot Artist. A childhood friend from Dania FL.

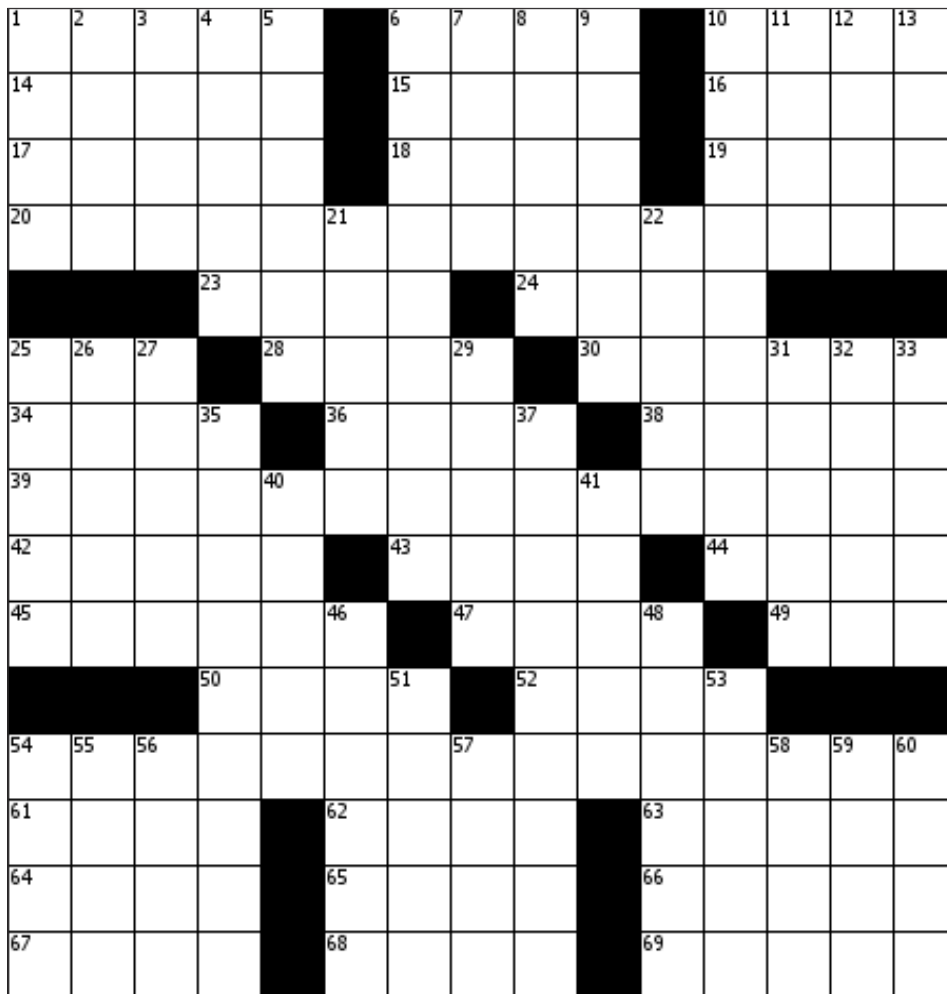

[online survey](#) to allow residents, especially older adults, to make important self-assessments on their COVID-19 behaviors through the Florida Department of Elder Affairs (DOEA).

The survey asks Floridians to review their decisions with respect to COVID-19 situations, to see how different actions affect their own health, and the health of others. The Florida Safe Survey allows individuals to have a tool at their disposal that fully engages them in the outcomes of their actions.

“Protecting Florida's most vulnerable has been my administration's main focus during this COVID-19 pandemic,” said **Governor DeSantis**. “With the Florida Safe Survey, we hope to further mitigate the spread of this disease and bring another layer of protection to those most at risk of severe symptoms from COVID-19.”

“With today's announcement, Floridians

across the state have a new opportunity to make a difference during these unprecedented times,” said **First Lady Casey DeSantis**. “This is a chance for Florida's aging population to ensure they are doing everything they can to get the best Safe Behavior Score possible with respect to COVID-19. Through this incredible innovation, we are given the opportunity to save lives.”

“Governor DeSantis knows Floridians are resilient, and he has worked tirelessly to bring Floridians together in the fight against COVID-19,” said **DOEA Secretary Richard Prudom**. “This survey furthers our effort by allowing all residents to get actionable and responsive feedback from their survey results and unite in their actions against COVID-19.”

The self-audit is available at [FloridaSafeSurvey.com](#) and takes only a few minutes to complete. Respondents of the survey may anonymously answer questions such as the amount and type of their weekly activities, the number of people in their household, their ability to receive physical or mental health assistance if needed, and the types of preventive measures used on a regular basis.

The Safe Behavior Report offers customized recommendations for each respondent and guides them to different

local, state, and national resources based on their answers to questions on geographic location, lifestyle, and personal experiences. The survey allows individuals to evaluate choices they make in everyday situations and possibly change future results based on behavior modifications.

“Through every phase of development, the team at DOEA was constantly ensuring we were best addressing the needs of Florida's older population,” said **James Firman, CEO of BellAge** — the company designing the survey and pairing it with data-driven analytics for risk assessments. “DOEA has helped us create an impressive prototype that's now being reviewed by several other states around the country.”

Anyone may take the Florida Safe Survey and view the invaluable results of The Safe Behavior Report. Additionally, Floridians may take the survey multiple times to see how any changed behavior may affect their health score. The resources, however, are selected from the Florida Aging Network pantheon of services most suited for older adults.

DOEA's 11 Area Agencies on Aging will assist in announcing and distributing information about the Florida Safe Survey by working with local service providers and volunteers to get the survey in front of Florida's most vulnerable population.

Attorney General Moody Expands Price Gouging Hotline to Cover Hurricane-Related Commodities as Tropical Storm Laura Approaches

TALLAHASSEE, Fla.—Attorney General Ashley Moody today expanded Florida's Price Gouging Hotline to receive reports of extreme price increases on essential commodities needed to prepare for the approaching storm. The expansion comes as Governor Ron DeSantis [declares a state of emergency](#) for Tropical Storm Laura in the following counties: Bay, Broward, Calhoun, Charlotte, Citrus, Collier, DeSoto, Dixie, Escambia, Franklin, Glades, Gulf, Hardee, Hendry, Hernando, Hillsborough, Jackson, Jefferson, Lee, Levy, Manatee, Miami-Dade, Monroe, Okeechobee, Palm Beach, Pasco, Pinellas, Santa Rosa, Sarasota, Taylor, Wakulla, Walton and Washington. Florida's price gouging laws for this event only apply within the area of the declared state of emergency and only for commodities and services essential to preparing for or recovering from the storm event.

The price gouging laws remain in effect statewide under the emergency declaration in response to the COVID-19 pandemic in March for [commodities that relate specifically to the health crisis](#). Other storm-related state of emergencies continue as a result of Hurricane Michael for 14 counties and Hurricane Isaias for 19 counties on the east coast of Florida.

Attorney General Ashley Moody said, “Floridians should prepare now, with enough food, water and other essential items needed in case this storm strikes their

community. With the declared state of emergency, I am expanding my Price Gouging Hotline to receive reports of extreme price increases on the essential items Floridians need to be prepared. If you see potential price gouging, please report it immediately so we can ensure Floridians are able to prepare without the added stress of excessive prices.”

During a storm-related declared state of emergency, state law prohibits excessive increases in the price of essential commodities, such as food, water, hotel rooms, ice, gasoline, lumber and equipment, needed as a direct result of the event. Anyone who suspects price gouging should report it to the Florida Attorney General's Office by using the NO SCAM app, visiting [MyFloridaLegal.com](#) or by calling 1 (866) 9NO-SCAM. The Attorney General's NO SCAM app can be downloaded for free through Apple and Android stores by searching NO SCAM.

Violators of the price gouging statute are subject to civil penalties of \$1,000 per violation and up to a total of \$25,000 for multiple violations committed in a single 24-hour period. In addition to the civil penalties for price gouging, state law criminalizes the sale of goods and services to the public without possession of a business tax receipt.

Attorney General Moody Hosts Symposium with Federal and State Agencies Regarding COVID-19 Schemes Targeting Medicaid

TALLAHASSEE, Fla.—Attorney General Ashley Moody today hosted a COVID-19 related Medicaid fraud symposium with federal and state agencies. Representatives from all three of Florida's U.S. Attorney Offices, the U.S. Department of Justice, the U.S. Health and Human Services Inspector General's Office and the Florida Agency for Health Care Administration participated in the virtual event. The discussion focused on the recent increase in Medicaid enrollment nationwide and fraud related to the COVID-19 pandemic. The group also discussed ways state and federal agencies can partner to protect taxpayer money and stop fraud and identity theft amid the current health crisis.

Attorney General Ashley Moody said, “My Medicaid Fraud Control Unit has been working throughout this pandemic to identify, investigate and stop fraudsters exploiting this important taxpayer-funded health care program. As a result of this health crisis and the resulting economic downturn, Florida is experiencing an increase in Medicaid enrollment. The goal of today's symposium was to bolster our individual and collective efforts to stay ahead of fraud trends related to the increased enrollment and COVID-19, and strengthen partnerships vital to upholding the integrity of the Medicaid program in Florida.”

U.S. Attorney for the Middle District of Florida Maria Chapa Lopez said, “Federal and state healthcare programs, such as Medicaid, are designed to assist people with limited income and resources during their time of greatest need. Criminals that target these programs or their beneficiaries during this national health crisis, or at any other time, can expect that we will join with our federal, state, and local partners to investigate and prosecute them to the fullest extent of the law. Today's symposium represents that commitment.”

Special Agent in Charge Omar Pérez Aybar of HHS OIG said, “Our oversight agency is dedicated to protecting beneficiaries of Medicaid and other federal health care programs, as well as safeguarding the financial integrity of those programs. With our law enforcement partners, we are aggressively targeting COVID-19 fraud schemes, bringing fraudsters to justice and warning the public about these scams. Today's symposium demonstrates the law enforcement community's commitment to efficiently and effectively shut down fraud, waste, and abuse during this unprecedented public health crisis.”

Attorney General Moody's MFCU works regularly with the state and federal agencies that participated in today's symposium to identify, investigate and prosecute Medicaid fraud cases. During the event, the participants discussed the increase in Medicaid enrollment and the opportunity the increase could create for criminals to exploit the government program to steal taxpayer money. The group also discussed ways to detect and prevent identity theft related to Medicaid and the pandemic, as well as fraud schemes designed to steal stimulus payments.

Earlier this year, Attorney General Moody issued a Consumer Alert warning Floridians about long-term care facilities seizing the stimulus payments of residents in the Medicaid program. To view the alert, visit [MyFloridaLegal.com](#).

Additionally, health care providers must remember to not seek payment from Medicaid recipients for co-payments, co-insurance, deductibles, or other cost-sharing during the declared state of emergency. On March 16, Florida Medicaid waived co-payment requirements for all services. Florida Medicaid also indicated it will pay for medically necessary services provided to Medicaid recipients diagnosed with COVID-19, regardless of whether the provider is located in-state or out-of-state.

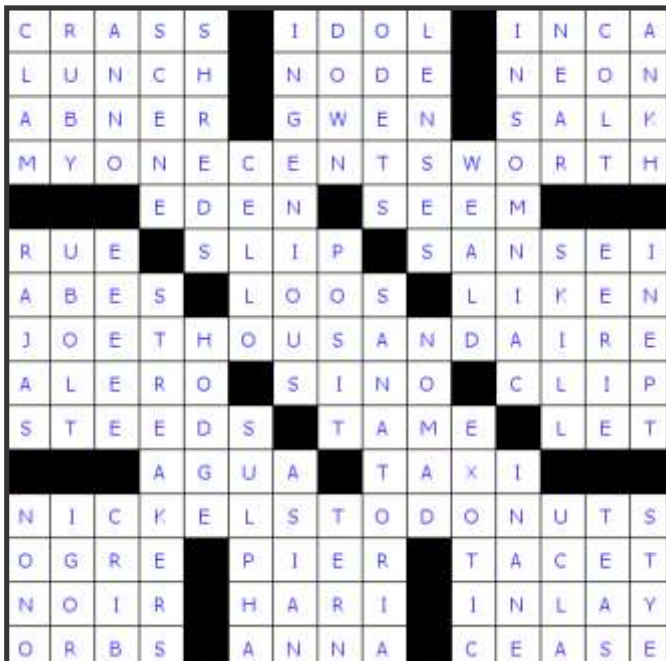
