I strongly believe that the CEP team is the best in the country. Recently, two of our members have received significant recognition which I think are worth sharing.



Dear Friends,
Thank you for taking the time out of your day to read this country undertaker's column and for shouldering the responsibility of being an informed citizen that cares about what happens in this state and country.

Many different feelings strike me as we look around at what is happening in the world today, but the strongest feeling that keeps rising to the top...is gratefulness. Grateful that we still live in a country where we have an incredible amount of freedom. A few weeks ago, the world watched the situation unfold in Afghanistan (thanks to

Joe Biden's complete lack of competency) where we saw images of mothers throwing their children over barbed wire in hopes that some friendly troops might take them out of the country. We saw Afghan youths clinging to U.S. cargo planes as they took off, only to come crashing back to the earth when they found they could hold on no longer. Such disturbing images remind us that freedom is that dear and most days we have no idea how fortunate and blessed we are to live in America. Let us keep the people of Afghanistan in our prayers that they may one day enjoy the freedoms that we do in this country and let our spirit of gratefulness glorify our heavenly father.

Our battle with COVID continues in

Florida and the recent surge is very concerning. At this point, there isn't anyone that hasn't been touched in some way by this illness and we grieve with those that have lost loved ones. We are extremely optimistic that a big part of this fight can be won through the use of the monoclonal antibody treatment and we encourage anyone who has tested positive to consider this option. In August, our Governor approved twenty different pop-up sites around the state that will administer this treatment, free of charge to Florida residents. As of this writing, there are at least six that are already open in Duval, Orange, Brevard, Broward, Pinellas, and Palm Beach counties. For more information, visit <https://floridahealthcovid19.gov/treatment/>. This is a lifesaving treatment but you have to act early and before your symptoms become too severe.

For months now, we have focused on prevention and that is fine, but those issues

have become very political. Some of them, for good reason. Mask mandates and vaccine passports have no business in a free society and our Governor has done a great job in balancing the issue of public safety and individual freedoms. There shouldn't be anything political about offering a treatment, yet Florida democrats are attacking Governor DeSantis for making this treatment available. Not because they don't think it works, but because they think the Governor should be mandating vaccines. Let people make their own medical decisions and let the Governor do his job. It's that simple.

We return to Tallahassee this month for our first week of committee meetings and in my next column, we should have a good report on what we see on the horizon for the 2022 Legislative Session. Thank you for letting me serve you in the Florida Senate.

ORLANDO, Fla. – Today, Governor Ron DeSantis announced that the State of Florida is setting up a new monoclonal antibody therapy treatment site in Orlando at Camping World Stadium. This location has the capacity to serve more than 300 patients per day and will be open from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. daily.

“Early monoclonal antibody treatment keeps people out of the hospital and saves lives,” said Governor Ron DeSantis. “We look forward to continuing to open these sites throughout the state and hope awareness about the treatment continues to spread.”

To find locations to receive monoclonal antibody treatments around the entire state, please visit floridahealthcovid19.gov.

“The monoclonal antibody treatment can be a game changer if you get it early,” said Secretary of the Agency for Health Care Administration Simone Marstiller. “I have seen firsthand how effective this therapy can be at keeping people out of the hospital and speeding their recovery. Once

again, Governor DeSantis has prioritized Florida's seniors and has created a delivery system for the monoclonal antibody treatment that will allow Florida's most vulnerable citizens to receive the treatment without leaving their long-term care facility and keeping them at home and out of hospitals.”

“The Division is committed to increasing access to monoclonal antibody therapy statewide, in coordination with the Florida Department of Health,” said Florida Division of Emergency Management (FDEM) Director Kevin Guthrie. “We will continue to work with County Emergency Management offices to identify additional locations for this lifesaving treatment and ensure that Floridians have access to all potential treatments that can help them recover from COVID-19.”

“This is a lifesaving treatment that needs more attention,” said FDEM Chief Medical Officer Dr. Kenneth Scheppke. “Thank you to Governor DeSantis for his dedication to protecting Floridians through innovative solutions. By increasing access to monoclonal antibody therapy through mobile and stationary sites, we will continue the fight against COVID-19 in Florida and bring this treatment to the individuals who need it most. Monoclonal antibodies have been used in medicine for decades and have the ability to protect the human body from viruses.”

Monoclonal antibody treatments can be

prescribed by health care providers to individuals 12 years of age and older who have been diagnosed with COVID-19 or who have been exposed to someone with COVID-19 and are at high risk for severe illness and hospitalization. However, to support Governor DeSantis' initiative, there is currently a standing order in Florida signed by the State Surgeon General that allows patients to receive this treatment without a prescription or referral if administered by an eligible health care provider. Such referrals are not required at any of the State of Florida monoclonal antibody treatment sites and treatments are available at no cost to patients.

The antibodies help the immune system recognize and respond effectively to the virus. According to [the treatment guidelines](#), they should be administered as soon as possible after diagnosis. By providing access to these treatments at these new sites, Governor DeSantis is alleviating demand on hospital resources and further making sure that Floridians have access to all potential treatments that can help them recover from COVID-19.

Governor DeSantis and the Florida Department of Health continue to encourage Floridians to receive the COVID-19 vaccine.



They Saved A Baby's Life

(NAPSI)—If your family is like most, you've spent months preparing for the joys and challenges that arise with the arrival of a new baby—and if your family is like many, you've discovered not everything can be planned.

One Family's Story

Consider the case of the McKennas: In July 2020, at six months pregnant with her second child, Erica McKenna and her husband Dan, received devastating news about their unborn daughter. Their baby

was experiencing a condition called maternal alloimmunization. This condition can occur when a pregnant woman's blood contains certain antibodies that attack the red blood cells of the fetus. This can cause the baby to become dangerously anemic.

Doctors told Erica if this condition was not treated, her baby would die. To stabilize and save her child's life, Erica's baby received five blood transfusions in utero starting at 24 weeks.

Just two months later, at eight months pregnant, Erica experienced worrying symptoms requiring immediate action. Within hours, she was in the hospital where she underwent an emergency C-section. Following delivery, her infant daughter was rushed

to the NICU where another three blood transfusions were needed.

Nearly a year later, Erica and Dan's daughter, Annie, is a thriving baby with a smile for everyone.

"You would never know she went through all of that," said Erica. "We're extremely lucky. We're grateful for the people who donate blood and the amazing doctors who took care of us both."

Arms Out For Annie

To give back, Erica and her family started Arms Out for Annie, a special blood donation campaign with a goal to recruit 100 donors to give blood in Annie's name before her first birthday on September 26.

"Annie's life was saved eight times," said Erica, referring to the eight transfusions her daughter received before and after birth. "She wouldn't be here without them. And I can't imagine our lives without her."

Attorney General Moody Activates Price Gouging Hotline in Preparation for Tropical Depression Fred

TALLAHASSEE, Fla.—Attorney General Ashley Moody today

activated Florida's Price Gouging Hotline as Tropical Depression Fred approaches the state. The activation follows Governor Ron DeSantis's [state of emergency declaration](#) covering Bay, Calhoun, Citrus, Dixie, Escambia, Franklin, Gadsden, Gilchrist, Gulf, Holmes, Jackson, Jefferson, Lafayette, Leon, Levy, Liberty, Manatee, Okaloosa, Santa Rosa, Taylor, Wakulla, Walton and Washington counties.

Floridians can now report instances of extreme price increases on essential commodities needed to prepare for the storm. Florida's price gouging law only applies to commodities and services essential to preparing for, or recovering from, a storm within the areas of a declared state of emergency.

Attorney General Ashley Moody said, "With Tropical Depression Fred approaching our shores, I'm urging all Floridians to be prepared. I've activated the state's price gouging hotline to accept reports of extreme price increases of essential goods in areas covered by the declared state of emergency. Help us

protect consumers—if you suspect price gouging, report it to my office using the free No Scam reporting app, or calling 1(866) 9NO-SCAM."

During a storm-related declared state of emergency, state law prohibits excessive increases in the price of essential commodities, such as food, water, hotel rooms, ice, gasoline, lumber and equipment, needed as a direct result of the event.

Anyone who suspects price gouging can report it to the Florida Attorney General's Office by using the No Scam app, visiting [MyFloridaLegal.com](#) or calling 1(866) 9NO-SCAM. The Attorney General's No Scam app can be downloaded for free on Apple and Android devices through the app store by searching No Scam.

Violators of the price gouging statute are subject to civil penalties of \$1,000 per violation and up to a total of \$25,000 for multiple violations committed in a single 24-hour period. In addition to the civil penalties for price gouging, state law criminalizes the sale of goods and services

to the public without possession of a business tax receipt.

Three Arrested for Abuse and Neglect Resulting in Third-Degree Burns

TALLAHASSEE, Fla.—Attorney General Ashley Moody's Medicaid Fraud Control Unit, with the assistance of the Orange County Sheriff's Office and Groveland Police Department, today announced the arrests of three Metro Orlando registered nurses for aggravated abuse and neglect of a disabled adult. Christina Hison, Linda Moore and Christopher Rodriguez Lozada are accused of causing third-degree burns to a disabled adult.

Attorney General Ashley Moody said, "This trio was trusted to provide care to a patient suffering from a serious health condition. Instead of acting in the best interest of the patient, they disobeyed hospital policy and established medical procedure. Because of their actions, the patient suffered a new set of medical issues requiring multiple surgeries. Thanks to the work of my Medicaid Fraud Control Unit and local law enforcement, these caregivers will be held accountable for their neglect and abuse. We will not tolerate abuse of our seniors in Florida."

According to the investigation, Hison,

Moore and Rodriguez Lozada worked as registered nurses for Select Specialty Hospital Orlando North, a long-term care hospital in Orlando. In September 2019, the three provided care to a disabled adult suffering from hypothermia. Against hospital policy and established medical procedure, Hison, Moore and Rodriguez Lozada applied ice bags filled with hot water—allegedly from a coffee maker with a hot water dispenser—to the disabled adult's body in an attempt to counter the patient's hypothermia. The disabled adult was then left alone for at least two hours before another employee discovered that the victim sustained several third-degree burns. As a result, the patient required transportation to Orlando Regional Medical Center to undergo several skin-graft surgeries.

Hison, Moore, and Rodriguez Lozada each face one count of aggravated abuse of a disabled adult, a first-degree felony; and neglect of a disabled adult, a second-degree felony. If convicted, each face up to 45 years in prison and up to \$20,000 in fines. The Office of the State Attorney for the Ninth Circuit will prosecute the case.


