expand.

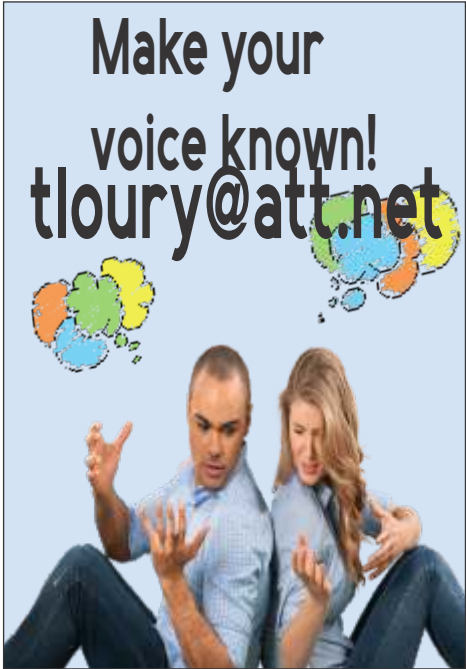
Chief Growth Officer

Dear friends,
This month we are continuing our report on the 2023 Legislative Session and all that we accomplished on behalf of Florida's citizens. Last month we reported to you on some of

the big budget items. Over the next few months, our column will focus on reporting on key pieces of legislation that was a priority of the leadership in the Florida Legislature.

HB 837 - For decades, Florida has been plagued by excessive litigation and a legal system that benefitted the lawyers more than people who are injured. Florida families have shouldered the hidden cost of lawsuit abuse. Florida's litigation environment has cost the state jobs and driven up the cost of goods and services. According to the American Tort Reform Association's "Judicial Hellhole" Report, lawsuit abuse costs Florida households more than \$5000, and costs the state more than 173,000 jobs. HB 837 institutes the most comprehensive tort reform in decades to decrease frivolous lawsuits and prevent predatory practices of trial attorneys that prey on hardworking Floridians. The transformative reforms in this bill will strike the right balance between protecting the rights of Floridians who suffer a loss, while at the same time safeguarding everyone else against the hidden costs of prolonged litigation.

HB 1 - Florida students should not have their educational opportunities limited due to arbitrary lines on a map or their family's income. Before HB 1, Florida's approach to education created a system that limits a student's choice to receive the full benefit

of their education pathway. This legislation shifts focus from systems to students and families, supporting a customized educational pathway specific to each student's unique needs. HB 1 builds on the foundation established in prior legislative sessions and expands access to Family Empowerment Scholarships to provide all Florida students with the opportunity to attend the public, private, charter, or home school of their choice at no or minimal cost to the student and family.

SB 300 - Recent legal developments provided the legislature the opportunity to strengthen the protections for the innocent unborn children in our state. The United States Supreme Court stated, "The Constitution does not prohibit the citizens of each state from regulating or prohibiting abortion." With an unprecedented opportunity as lawmakers to protect innocent life, and to stand with the brave moms who choose life for their babies, this legislation provides for robust protections of innocent life by prohibiting abortions after six-weeks. SB 300 promotes healthy families and supports parents who chose life for their babies by providing additional counseling or mentoring services as well as providing nonmedical material assistance to families such as car seats, cribs, clothing, formula, and diapers. This legislation provides the moment of reflection for the humanity in all of us to protect and support pregnant mothers and their unborn child. We as a society have a responsibility and duty to protect the life of the unborn.

We hope this information will help you better understand your government and encourage your continued engagement in helping us preserve faith, family, freedom, opportunity and life. It is an honor to serve you in the Florida Senate.

Supreme Court exposes more IRS abusive powers

SUPREME COURT EXPOSES MORE IRSABUSIVE POWERS

If you're going to have a federal income tax, there are three things that inevitably come along with it.

First, there are going to be people who try to cheat the system in order to pay less than they actually owe. Consequently, an income tax requires a large, powerful federal agency with broad investigative and enforcement powers in order to identify the cheaters and compel them to comply with the law.

Second, those powers must be precisely defined and delegated to the enforcement agency by Congress.

And third, there will inevitably be cases where the courts are going to have to decide if the agency is properly exercising those powers, or if certain enforcement practices are outside the law.

The Supreme Court's unanimous decision in *Polselli v. Internal Revenue Service* confirmed that the IRS has a broad power to obtain information from third parties to aid in the collection of a tax debt without giving notice to the third parties even if there is no evidence that the third party accounts have any legal connection to the party who owes the IRS.

This article on the natlawreview.com site explains the effects of this ruling:

- The Court was tasked with determining whether the IRS, pursuant to powers granted in Internal Revenue Code (IRC) section 7609(c)(2)(D)(i), is entitled to issue third-party summonses, without notice, for bank records concerning accounts in which the taxpayer being investigated does not have a legal interest.
- In *Polselli*, the IRS entered an official assessment against Remo Polselli for more than \$2 million in unpaid taxes and penalties. The IRS then issued summonses on three banks, seeking the financial records of several third parties including Polselli's wife and two law firms that represented Polselli. These third parties were given notice by the banks who received the summonses, and one of the third parties moved to quash the summons. In the litigation that ensued, the third parties argued that the no-notice exception in section 7609(c)(2)(D)(i) applied only if the taxpayer being targeted had some legal interest in the accounts or the records sought by the summons.
- The Supreme Court's decision is based on its finding that section 7609(c)(2)(D)(i) sets forth only three specific conditions to exempt the IRS from providing notice. The Court found it notable that the statute does not mention a "legal interest" or require that a taxpayer maintain an interest in an account for the exception to apply.

Remember the ex-FBI agent that went to prison??? He was found dead in his cell recently while all this whistle blower talk was going on. I wonder if he knew to much?

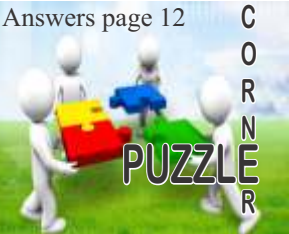

TALLAHASSEE, Fla.—Attorney General Ashley Moody's Office of Statewide Prosecution is charging a human trafficker with multiple felonies for coercing women and a teenager into sex work for the trafficker's personal gain. The Boca Raton Police Department arrested Brandon Gutman on charges of human trafficking of a minor and human trafficking of an adult. According to the investigation, Gutman withheld all money and identification documents from the women, and knowingly trafficked a 16-year-old girl.

Attorney General Ashley Moody said, "This human trafficker kept women under his control with physical abuse and by withholding all their identification documents. He then forced them into sex work for his own financial profit, including knowingly trafficking a young 16-year-old girl. Thanks to the bravery of the survivors working with authorities and the investigative efforts of law enforcement, this predator will now face my Statewide Prosecutors."

According to a joint investigation by BRPD, the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office's Human Trafficking Task Force and the Federal Bureau of Investigation, Gutman ran a trafficking operation for

several years. In the operation, Gutman used physical and sexual violence, threats and emotional and financial manipulation to coerce women to engage in commercial sex acts for Gutman's own profit. The investigation also uncovered that Gutman trafficked a 16-year-old girl, forcing the teen to engage in exotic dancing and commercial sex acts.

Attorney General Moody's Statewide Prosecutors charged Gutman with one count of human trafficking of a minor for commercial sexual activity; a first-degree felony, two counts of human trafficking of an adult for commercial sexual activity; first-degree felonies, and several other related charges.

If convicted, Gutman faces a life sentence. Attorney General Moody's Assistant Statewide Prosecutor Joshua Dockus will prosecute the case.

JURY DUTY SCAMS ON THE RISE
TALLAHASSEE, Fla.—Attorney General Ashley Moody is issuing a Consumer Alert warning Floridians about an increase in jury duty scams. In these scams, an imposter will call a target about missing jury duty, then threaten the potential victim with jail time if a fine is not paid. A recent news report from Miami-Dade County states that authorities there are

seeing an alarming number of jury duty scams.

Attorney General Ashley Moody said, "This scam is so troubling because the scammer on the phone will threaten a victim with potential jail time if a fine is not paid. Floridians should know that failing to report for jury duty is not grounds for immediate arrest, and court officials will never demand payment over the phone. By being aware of how to avoid this increasingly common scam, we can build a Stronger, Safer Florida."

To avoid jury duty scams, Floridians should know that:

- A jury duty summons will never be delivered over the phone; it will always come via mail. Also, officials will not call regarding a summons if a person did not receive a summons in the mail;
- Court officials will not demand payment over the phone, nor ask that

payment be wired or made through a gift card. A tell-tale sign of a jury scam is a caller aggressively demanding payment;

- Personal or financial information should never be given to strangers, especially over the phone;
- Caller IDs may be spoofed to appear to be coming from a law enforcement agency or other government entity, so be cautious of caller ID—even if it looks like a real source; and
- If there is a valid jury duty issue, contact a local court clerk's office directly.

The Florida Bar reminds Floridians to be cautious over the phone and remember that an authentic jury summons will only ever come in the mail from the United States Postal Service.

Report suspected jury duty scams to law enforcement, as well as to the local county clerk's office using the Florida Clerks website.

"Governor Ron DeSantis Announces Florida's Unemployment Rate Remains Lowest Among 10 Largest States in the Nation for the Twelfth

Consecutive Month

Florida's unemployment rate remains lower than the nation's for 31 consecutive months since November 2020

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. — Today, Governor Ron DeSantis announced that Florida's unemployment rate remains the lowest among the 10 largest states in the nation for the twelfth consecutive month. In May 2023, Florida's unemployment rate remained at 2.6 percent for the fifth consecutive month. Florida's statewide unemployment rate of 2.6 percent was 1.1 percentage points below the national rate of 3.7 percent. In May 2023, Florida's private sector employment increased by 17,200 jobs from the previous month, and by 323,400 jobs (3.9 percent) over the year, faster than the nation's private sector job growth rate of 2.7 percent during the same time period.

"Florida's unemployment rate has remained the lowest of the 10 largest states for an entire year —further proof that our Freedom First policies have strengthened our economy," said **Governor Ron DeSantis**. "Florida will continue to protect taxpayers, foster new business formations,

and maintain a responsible budget."

"Under Governor DeSantis' leadership, Florida's economy continues to encourage both job seekers and job creators, with a private sector job growth rate exceeding the nation's for 26 consecutive months," said **J. Alex Kelly, Secretary of the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity (DEO)**. "Florida's economy continues to thrive under the leadership of Governor DeSantis, with unemployment at a consistently low rate of 2.6 percent and labor force growth at 2.3 percent."

In May 2023, Florida's labor force grew by 246,000 (+2.3 percent) over the year since May 2022, faster than the national labor force growth rate of 1.5 percent during the same time period. Over the month in May 2023, Florida's labor force grew by 38,000 jobs (+0.3 percent), which is triple the nation's labor force growth rate of 0.1 percent during the same time period. Florida's over-the-year private sector job growth rate has exceeded the nation's for 26 consecutive months. In May 2023, total private sector employment increased by 17,200 over the month, an increase of 0.2 percent from the previous month.

In May 2023, the education and health services sector gained the most jobs among all major industries, adding 8,800 jobs (+0.6 percent) from the previous month, followed by professional and business services with 6,200 jobs (+0.4 percent) and leisure and hospitality, adding 3,700 jobs (+0.3 percent).

Data from the month of May continues to indicate there are many job opportunities available for Floridians throughout the state, with more than 450,000 jobs posted online. Floridians in search of work and new job

opportunities are encouraged to turn to the [CareerSource Florida network](#) for help. Floridians can find guidance on how to register with [Employ Florida](#) and search listings of available local job openings. Career seekers also can improve their employability by perfecting resume writing and interviewing skills, establishing career goals, and pursuing customized career training. These services are provided at no cost to job seekers.

Congresswoman Kat Cammack announces Gainesville Fire Rescue As Recipient Of DHS, FEMA's 'Assistance To Firefighters' Grant

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Today,

Congresswoman Kat Cammack (FL-03) announced Gainesville Fire Rescue's (GFR) 'Assistance To Firefighters' Grant (AFG) award from the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). The department will receive \$47,122 to improve its operations and safety, including using the grant for new protective equipment.

the very best of our first responder community," she said.

"Gainesville Fire Rescue is pleased to accept funding via the AFG that will go directly to equipment supporting frontline service providers," said Gainesville Fire Rescue Chief Joseph Dixon. "Representative Cammack's experience as a Homeland Security Committee Member coupled with her direct knowledge of the firefighting community make her a welcome and formidable advocate."

In FY 2020, the AFG program administered nearly \$320 million in competitive grants to eligible applicants whose awards will best address the priorities of the AFG program.

Rep. Cammack introduces Bill

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Today, Congresswoman Kat Cammack (R-FL-03), Congressman Barry Moore (R-AL-02), Congresswoman Elissa Slotkin (D-MI-07), and Congressman Jimmy Panetta (D-CA-19) introduced a bill to include phosphate and potash on the final list of critical minerals of the Department of the Interior.

"A nation that cannot feed itself is not secure. Without the necessary inputs to feed, clothe, and fuel our nation, we're leaving our

food and national security up to our adversaries," said Congresswoman Cammack. "Adding these vital re-sources to the Critical Minerals List will encourage increased domestic production and deliver much-needed relief to the Florida producers who rely on these inputs for their crops. We have the resources here at home—it's time we tap into them. I thank my colleagues for their support of this effort and look forward to their continued partnership."

"America's producers are the only customers who buy their inputs at retail cost and sell their outputs at wholesale price. Farmers, ranchers, and foresters in Alabama have been dealing with profit margins too thin to take care of their families," said Congressman Barry Moore. "Designating phosphate and potash as critical minerals is the first step in tapping our capacity for domestic production of our producers' input costs, namely affordable fertilizer products."

"Our food security is our national security, so when we're dependent on Russian and Chinese minerals for the fertilizer that grows our crops, we are putting ourselves at risk," said Congresswoman Slotkin. "Adding potash and phosphate to the Department of Interior's Critical Minerals List will accurately reflect their strategic importance, encouraging increased domestic production, lowering fertilizer costs for our farmers, and keeping

our food supply secure. And as one of the only states to hold its own supply of potash, Michigan is well-equipped to fuel a resurgence in production."

"American producers are feeling the high prices for fertilizer due to the war in Ukraine and its disruption of the supply chains for needed minerals," said Congressman Panetta. "We want to help our farmers with this bipartisan legislation that would allow the federal government to readily tap into our domestic potash and phosphate resources. Despite the devastation and destruction in Ukraine, we are acting in Congress to protect American agriculture and preserve global food security."

Senator Thom Tillis (R-NC) is the lead sponsor of the legislation in the U.S. Senate.
