He was forced to resign from the Office of Sheriff and withdraw from the election, he has now proven that he is innocent of all charges...

GUILTY UNTIL PROVEN INNO-CENT...

My name is Sangi Blair and I am the proud wife of former Sheriff Chris Blair. I spent over 35 years serving the citizens of Marion County in the Criminal Justice field both as a Probation Officer and as an Academy Instructor and Coordinator. My husband served Marion County as both a Deputy and as a Sheriff for a total of 38 years. Throughout his 35+ year career as a Deputy, he served under three different Sheriffs and was promoted by each of them. He is one of the most highly decorated deputies in the history of the Marion County Sheriff's Office, receiving numerous awards and commendations to include Medals of Commendation, the Medal of Distinction, and Law Enforcement Officer of the Year. But... when my husband decided to run for the office of Sheriff, he was immediately met by opposition from the Marion County "Good Old Boys" to include State Attorney Brad King.

Even though my husband had came through the ranks of the MCSO and was the only candidate running for Sheriff in 2012 who had law enforcement experience, the "Good Old Boys" chose to support and endorse Dan Kuhn, an attorney with NO law enforcement experience. Even when Kuhn withdrew from the election because of a sex scandal, my husband still faced adversity. In fact, SA Brad King went so far as to call and personally meet with members of the Republican Executive Committee and asked them not to put my husband back on the ballot. This was a clear attempt to use his elected position to try and sway the election, a violation of the Hatch Act under federal law.

When my husband was elected Sheriff, he immediately began to deal with constant pressure from SA King involving unending reviews of MCSO cases and policies and procedures. Even though the majority of the policies had been established under the previous Sheriff, now, years later, they came under scrutiny by King.

In March of 2016, SA King personally impaneled a Grand Jury to investigate the MCSO. On April 8, 2016, my husband filed a petition with Governor Rick Scott outlining the personal bias that SA King had demonstrated in the past towards my husband. The petition asked that Governor Scott appoint an outside agency to conduct the investigation so that it could be run fairly and impartially. My husband asked the Florida Department of Law Enforcement to conduct the investigation but he was turned down. He then asked investigators from the Brevard County Sheriff's Office to conduct the investigation but after a short time, they



OCALA/MARION COUNTY CHAMBER & ECONOMIC PARTNERSHIP



August has been an incredible month for our community. Each day brings more excitement as we see and hear about new businesses growing and expanding here.

FedEx At the beginning

of the month we celebrated the official opening of the new FedEx Ground Hub located in the Ocala/Marion County Commerce Park. This facility was first announced in February 2013 and construction was completed on

this \$180 million facility this summer. The facility will quickly employ approximately 500 people. As a Ground Hub, packages from throughout the country will be sorted for distribution throughout Florida. As exciting as this first phase is, it is only the first phase. It is anticipated that eventually this facility will more than double in size to 1 million square feet and employ more than 1000 people.

AutoZone

We have been joking that perhaps we need to rename the Ocala/Marion County Commerce Park "Memphis South" with AutoZone joining fellow Memphis-based FedEx at the park. AutoZone will soon be-

gin construction on a 400,000 sq. ft., \$50 million distribution center which will service Florida and Puerto Rico. The distribution center will employ 240 people at wages which are 15% higher than the county's average wage.

AutoZone looked broadly for a location for this facility and the CEP along with City, County, CareerSource, and others worked nearly two years to make an Ocala location a winner. Having two major logistics related companies in this new park with high visibility along I-75 becomes a great calling card for other logistics-focused companies looking in the state.

Business Expansion

In addition to the new companies, we are very excited about the tremendous expansion activity happening all over our community. The CEP has a very active Business Retention team which meets with hundreds of local existing businesses each year, looking to determine barriers to their growth and working to remove those barriers. Our assistance runs from helping companies access tax credits and deductions to workforce assistance to permitting help to business match making. Any time we can help local businesses start doing business with other local companies, it is nothing but a win for everyone.

So far this year, we have been directly involved in helping local companies with expansions which will result in capital investments of nearly \$10 million and more than 500 additional jobs! Those are great numbers any time but especially when we still have several months left in the year.

Aggressively working to attract new primary employers and helping existing companies prosper is at the core of who the CEP is and what we do. Creative approaches to reaching this goal is what makes our community unique. Together, we can keep our dynamic metro Moving Forward!

New Initiative Aims To Reduce Repeat Heart Attacks

(NAPS)—Every 42 seconds, someone in the U.S. has a heart attack—but you needn't be among them.

Consider this: Julie Kubala was one of those statistics. She's working now to ensure she doesn't become a different stat—about 21 percent of women and 17 percent of men age 45 and older will have another heart attack within five years of their first one.

To help, the American Heart Associa-

tion (AHA) launched a new educational campaign aimed at reducing the number of repeat or recurrent heart attacks by arming survivors with simple but effective steps.

"Our message is simple: Don't wait for a second heart attack," said Alice Jacobs, M.D., former AHA president and chair of the advisory group overseeing the new initiative. "Research shows there are some very clear things you can do to lower your chances of having another event."

- Take medication as directed —More than a third of heart disease patients don't follow their medication treatment plans; more than a third of medication-related hospital readmissions are caused by people not taking their medicine as they should.
- · Have a follow-up doctor's appointment-Heart attack survivors who don't have a timely follow-up with their doctor may be up to 10 times more likely to be rehospitalized.
- · Complete a cardiac rehabilitation program—One study found that heart patients who completed cardiac rehab were 42 percent less likely to die of a second heart attack than those who didn't.
- Manage risk factors—Reducing risk factors such as physical inactivity, high blood pressure, high blood cholesterol, diabetes, smoking and obesity lowers the chance of having a heart attack or needing heart surgery.
- Develop a strong support system—People with low perceived social support have worse outcomes after a heart attack.

Kubala goes to cardiac rehab and is learning the importance of being proactive to take control of her health.

"I knew my family history of high blood pressure, high cholesterol, diabetes. What hadn't really hit me was our family history of heart disease or how all of that can be

School Bus State Law

School's Open - Drive Carefully:

School Bus Laws & Penalties In Florida
No matter where in Florida you may live,
keeping our children and students safe is a
community responsibility. There are many
guidelines put in place to ensure that our students arrive to and from school safely every
single day - designated crosswalks, Community Service Aides, seat belt laws, and
so on. But one law that is absolutely crucial
- and yet often gets ignored - is ALWAYS
stopping behind a school bus.

The State of Florida has enacted laws that require every single driver to stop when a school bus has its "Stop" sign extended and its red lights flashing. But sometimes impatient drivers may think to themselves, "There are no children crossing the street, and I'll drive very slowly so I can stop if I see one. I don't have time to sit and wait for this bus!" Drivers like these should think again: the penalties for passing stopped school bus could literally stop you in your tracks for quite a long time.

What Will Happen If I Pass a Bus?

Anyone caught passing a stopped school bus or speeding in a school zone can expect to get a costly fine. The State of Florida pulls no punches when it comes to the safety of its students and the local Police Department simply will not tolerate violations that could harm a child.

We also take into account which side of the bus you chose when violating the law. While neither side is necessarily "safer," the amount of danger to kids sharply increases if you pass the bus on the right-hand side, as this is the side that the children use to step off of the bus, and therefore are more likely to be struck by your car.

If you pass the bus on the right-hand side, you will pay a minimum fine of \$265 for your first offense. A second offense within 5 years of this nature carries an additional \$265 fine, as well as the suspension of your license for 180 days to one year and a mandatory court hearing.

Drivers who pass on the left-hand side are no less culpable for their actions. Your first offense will cost you \$165, and a second offense will add another \$165 to that total, along with license suspension of 90 days to 6 months.

You will also be required to attend and successfully complete a basic driver improvement course and you must complete the course within the time allotted by the court which has dealt with your citation. Submission of successful completion proves to the state that you have reviewed and refreshed your knowledge of Florida traffic laws, including those dealing with school zones and school buses.

Remember - Kids are Just Kids!

Although any parent whose child takes the bus to and from school has no doubt cautioned them about the dangers of traffic, we need to remember that children are still young and still learning. With all of the distractions and noises that are abundant on school busses, it's easy to imagine a child stepping off of the bus and not being able to hear oncoming traffic. We are the adults; it is our duty to abide by the laws put in place and give our children a safe environment in which to learn, play, and grow.

Have Fun, Stay Safe: Family Safety Tips For Outdoor Fun

(NAPS)—Your kids should move... move around, that is. The American College of Sports Medicine recommends that children participate in 60 minutes of physical activity every day. Physical activity on a regular basis, combined with healthy eating habits, will prevent obesity and other diseases.

Kids need outdoor play to be active, burn up excess energy and have fun. There are, however, a few steps you can take to protect them from injury.

What You Can Do

Here are seven simple safety tips from Joan Lawrence, Toy Industry Association's "Toy Safety Mom," to help keep your child's outdoor play as safe as it is fun:

- 1. Make adult supervision a crucial part of outdoor play.
- 2. Watch children carefully whenever they're near water. Kids should never be left alone near swimming pools, beaches, lakes or other bodies of water—even "kiddie" pools—no matter what their ages or swim capabilities. Children under 5 should always be no more than an arm's length from an adult near water sources.
 - 3. Always keep toys away from unsuper-



vised and high-traffic areas, such as driveways and sidewalks, so they don't lure a child into a dangerous situation.

- 4. Ride safely. Make sure your kids wear helmets, knee pads and other protective gear when playing with bikes, trikes, scooters and other ride-on toys. Accidental falls are the No. 1 cause of childhood injury, according to the National Center for Injury Prevention and Control.
- 5. Organize and store toys to prevent slips, trips and falls. Designate "parking" spaces for bikes and other ride-on toys and



were told to "stand down" by SA King as they were interfering with his investigation. Unfortunately, the petition to the Governor went unanswered and on May 19, 2016, my husband was indicted by the Grand Jury and was arrested the following day. The arrest of my husband was nothing more than a political assassination by SA Brad King as a payback for the downfall of Kings' friend and former employee Dan Kuhn. The day that my husband was arrested, he was immediately suspended without pay. He lost his career and his dignity without even the benefit of a trial. He was crucified by the press and social media without having the opportunity to tell his side. These charges stemmed from allegations that my husband had denied seeing the face of Dustin Heathman on June 1, 2014. Heathman, who is now serving a life sentence plus 80 years for multiple charges to include the attempted murder of a Law Enforcement Officer, had fired over 50 rounds at the MCSO SWAT Team during a lengthy standoff that day.

On July 28, 2016, SA King offered a Deferred Prosecution Agreement which stated that all charges against my husband would be dropped if he withdrew from the election and resigned from the Office of Sheriff. The decision to accept the Agreement was an extremely difficult one to make but it was made in the best interest of our family, particularly our children, the men and women of the MCSO, and the citizens of Marion County. SA King had distracted the men and

women of the MCSO from their mission of serving the citizens of Marion County and had wasted a significant amount of tax dollars to satisfy his own personal vendetta.

My husband has now proven that he was INNOCENT of all charges brought against him by SA Brad King. It was proven both by photographs and official reports, that the charges brought against my husband were completely FALSE and that he was indicted, arrested, suspended, and subsequently removed from office and the election for something that he DID NOT DO. I would like to first point out that I know what happened on June 1, 2014 because I too, was there that day. The following is the account of what was proven beyond a reasonable doubt on August 26, 2016 at a press conference held on the steps of the Marion County Courthouse:

During the Grand Jury, my husband was asked specifically if had seen the face of Dustin Heathman at the time that he was being treated by medics. My husband responded that he had seen the back of him as he was surrounded by numerous people. My husband was also asked by a civil attorney to complete a sworn affidavit and to outline when he had seen Dustin Heathman in a patrol vehicle. Heathman was treated by medics when he first arrived at the Command Center in a patrol vehicle at 5:52 pm. At that time, he was surrounded by deputies and paramedics and only the back of him could be seen. Also, while Heathman was being treated, my husband went to another

location to check on his SWAT Team and he also prayed with them (See Photo 1 which depicts the location of the rescue vehicle as they were treating Heathman)

The video that was shown to the Grand Jury and used as the ONLY evidence to indict my husband, depicts two deputies escorting Dustin Heathman from a patrol vehicle to a SWAT vehicle so that he can be interviewed. This occurred at approximately 6:50 pm, almost an hour AFTER Heathman was treated by paramedics (See Photo 2 which depicts the time when Heathman was being led into the SWAT vehicle to be interviewed).

As you can see, my husband was asked to complete a sworn affidavit and was questioned during the Grand Jury about a specific incident that took place on June 1, 2014 regarding Dustin Heathman, and he answered TRUTHFULLY. All information discussed in this article was verified by MCSO and Marion County Fire Rescue written statements, MCSO audio interviews, crime scene photographs and videos, and

the MCSO Communications Report.

In the words of Martin Luther King Jr., "Our lives begin to end the day we become silent about things that matter." Governor Rick Scott has always been a supporter of the Florida Sheriffs and the law enforcement profession as a whole. As the wife of not only a Sheriff but also a law enforcement officer who has dedicated his life to serving and protecting others, I have asked that Governor Scott open an investigation into State Attorney Brad King and the State's Attorney's Office. If my husband, a decorated lawman and the top law enforcement officer in the county, can be falsely arrested by the top two attorneys at the State Attorney's Office, one must ask how many others have they done this to? I ask you, the citizens of Marion County, to write or call Governor Scott and request an investigation as you, the voters, were deprived the right to elect the Sheriff of your choice because Brad King used his power to make that decision for you. But which seafood? Concerns about overfishing and environmental contamination may make people unsure of their seafood choices, so here are a few handy tips to make the choices clearer:

Sustainable fisheries: It is well known that some species of fish are in critical decline due to overfishing, so it's best to eat fish from healthy, renewable sources.

- Sustainable: Sardines (brisling), Alaskan salmon, catfish, crab, Atlantic mackerel.
 - Watch list: Atlantic halibut, shark, or-

ange roughy, monkfish, bluefin tuna.

Wild-Caught: Food producers have reacted to depleted fisheries by "farming" seafood, either on land in pools or in shoreline pens. But while this limits ocean overfishing, it leads to other problems, such as sanitary conditions, environmental hazards, and cross-breeding with native species.

- Wild-Caught: Sardines, mackerel, Pacific cod, wild trout, Pacific rockfish.
- Farmed: Tilapia, farmed Atlantic salmon, imported shrimp.

John Engle, president of King Oscar USA, a Norwegian-based seafood company that cans both premium sardines and mackerel, said, "Making the right seafood choices

is really important for consumers, but it is hard to thread the needle. They are looking for fish from healthy, sustainable stocks, that are also free of pollutXants and wild caught. Our fish happen to be in a can, which will surprise some people, but all are wild caught, contain no genetically modified ingredients and are harvested from sustainable stock. It's a really simple and clean product."
